## WBTV Presents KM Documentary To County's Historical Society

The Jefferson Standard Broadcasting Co. through WBTV of Charlotte has provided the Cleveland County Historical Society with a kinescope of the Battle of Kings Mountain documentary recently telecast on the station's "Land of the Free" program.

The film was made available at no cost to the society as a Jefferson Standard contribution to the society's efforts to assemble worthwhile historical data, documents and relics to form the nucleus for the eventual establishment of a county historical museum.

Society President Jim Allen says that, "The kinescope is an excellent addition to the society's growing accumulation of valuable relics and records. We are most appreciative of WBTV's interest and cooperation."

The documentary on the battle of Kings Mountain was written for Channel 3 by Ed Smith of Kings Mountain, a member of the Cleveland County Historical Society, and is illustrated with photographs and detailed close-ups of the battle.
