Ceremonies Mark Founding Of G-W College

BOILING SPRINGS — Gardner Webb college dedicated three buildings Saturday during a successful Homecoming - Founders Day which saw the institution praised for the scope and depth of its educational and spiritual outreach.

The A. T. Withrow Science Building, the Bost Physical Educational Building and the Lutz-Yelton Residence Hall for men were dedicated during a luncheon attended by 300 persons. The luncheon followed an 11:30 meeting of the Alumni officers and directors.

During the Alumni meeting, Dr. Eugene Poston, president, noted that the college is now ready to begin full time work in the area of alumni and that plans are now being formulated for employing someone as an executive secretary in alumni work.

Following the luncheon, an open house was held on campus followed at 5 p.m. by a barbecue attended by an estimated 200 persons. The Gardner-Webb Pep Band and Cheerleaders offered entertainment and Coach John Spencer introduced the football players.

Miss Celeste Ball, a sophomore from Charlotte, was crowned Homecoming Queen at halftime of the Chowan - Gardner-Webb football game Saturday evening. Gardner-Webb's team closed out the successful day whipping Chowan 30-14 before an estimated 3,000 persons in Blanton Memorial Stadium.

Formal dedication of the buildings was in the O. Max Gardner Building with portraits of four persons unveiled during ceremonies. Unveiled were portraits of L. C. Bost and Mrs. Jean Bost Gardner, A. T. Withrow and Mrs. Rush Stroup.

Lloyd Bost, son of L. C. Bost and brother of the late Mrs. Jean Bost Gardner, made the presentation of the Bost Physical Education Building and swimming pool. Bost said, "Our Christian colleges and our churches can continue to broaden and enlarge what support we give them after we have long left this arena of life. It is the lot of man to be here only a short period of time, relatively speaking, but it is through him that vision must be born and institutions such as Gardner-Webb be assured of influence and outreach for generations to come."

Paris Yelton, spokesman for the Lutz-Yelton Company and stockholders, said, "We have long been interested in Gardner-Webb College and its future because of the many advantages and opportunities that it offers to the youth and citizens of this and surrounding counties. We believe in free enterprise and are convinced that Gardner-Webb College is a part of the free enterprise system. We believe that this college is contributing greatly in making a better place in which to live."

A. T. Withrow, a native of

Rutherford County and now a resident of Charlotte, challenged alumni and guests to "aim at stars, if you hit a stump." He recalled the early struggles of Gardner-Webb and of what it meant to him personally to know he has a part in making possible the education of many young men and women. "What we have here can be a blessing to the area, the nation and perhaps the world," said Withrow.
