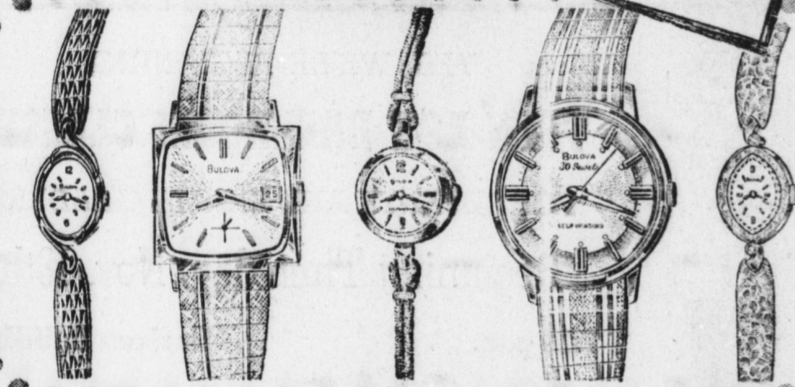

### and SOCIAL SECURITY

Q—I served in the Army during World War II and have heard that I receive some kind of social security credit for this service. How do I go about claiming such credit?

A—Every person who had active military service during World War II and was discharged under conditions other than dishonorable is given free social security credit for wages of \$160 for each month of such service. You do not have to do anything about this now. When a claim for benefits is filed, this period of military service will be considered and used—if the inclu-

sion of such credits will increase the monthly benefits.  
Q—Every summer when I go to Reserve camp, the Army takes social security taxes out of my pay. In civilian life, I earn the maximum amount under social security. How can I stop the Army from taking out the tax?  
A—You can't. The law requires each employer to deduct the social security tax from wages paid to their employees. Since you overpay your social security tax each year, you can claim a refund or a credit on the excess tax when you file your income tax return after the end of the year.
