

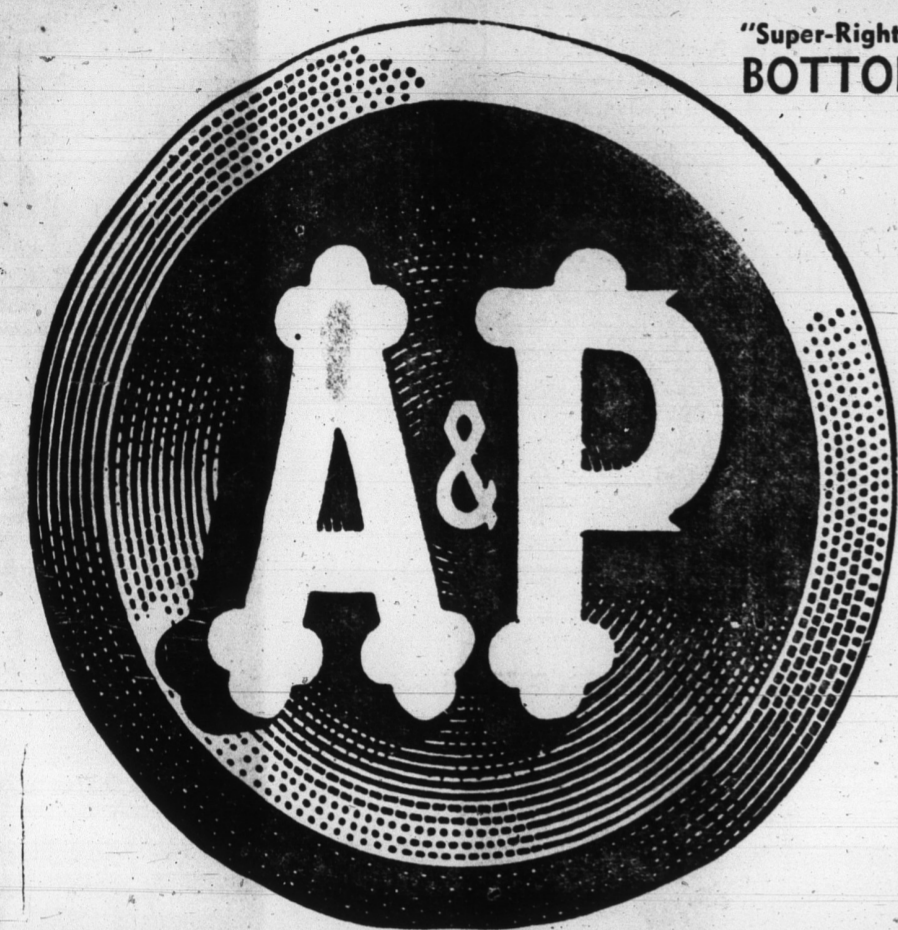

## Area Seniors Are Now Competing For Fourth 1966 PPG Scholarship

Shelby, N. C. — Area high school senior boys and girls are competing for the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Foundation scholarship being offered for the fourth straight year, according to J. V. Scheppe, Foundation Agent and local plant manager for Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company.

The competition is open to only those students who have taken the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test and filed their PPG Foundation applications last spring, and will be graduating from designated area high schools or who are children of employees graduating from secondary schools elsewhere in 1966.

Test results are evaluated by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation to determine final lists from which the 1966 winners will be selected by the PPG Foundation Scholarship Committee of prominent university educators. Finalists will be interviewed next February and the winner selected on the basis of

test scores, scholastic record, school recommendations, motivation, leadership, citizenship, and general character.

The PPG Foundation scholarship winner will receive an award ranging from \$250 to \$1500 yearly, depending on the student's financial need as determined by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation.

Mr. Scheppe reminded junior class students interested in the Foundation's 1966-67 scholarship program they must take the NMSQT on Saturday, February 26, 1966, or Tuesday, March 1, 1966. Also, juniors must file their PPG Foundation applications with him by March 31, 1966, to become eligible for the scholarship program in their senior year.

Students can obtain an application and brochure on the 1966-67 PPG Foundation community scholarship program from their high school principal, or by writing to Mr. Scheppe at the local Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company plant.

## Davis Assigned To Police Battalion
