

Duke Endowment have appropriated \$195,500 to assist 31 rural Methodist churches in North Carolina in financing building projects costing nearly \$11/2 mil-

The appropriations include \$104,500 to 14 churches in the North Carolina Conference and \$91,000 to 17 churches in the Western North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church.

The money is being used by the churches for a variety of purposes and for projects in various stages of construction. Some have been completed.
