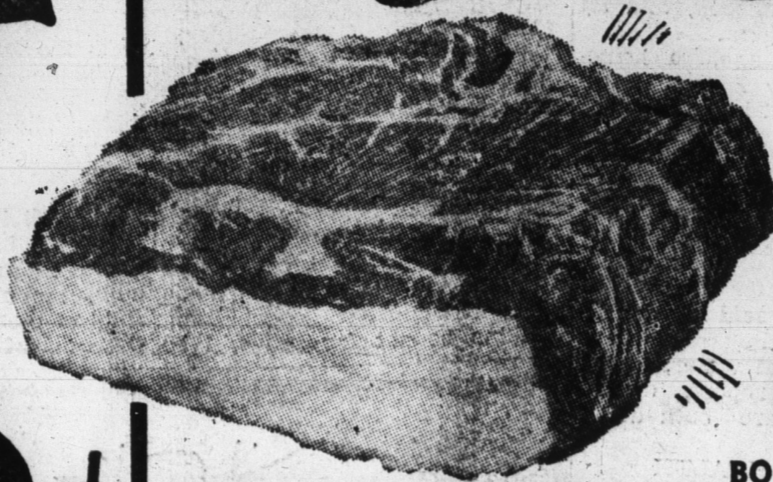

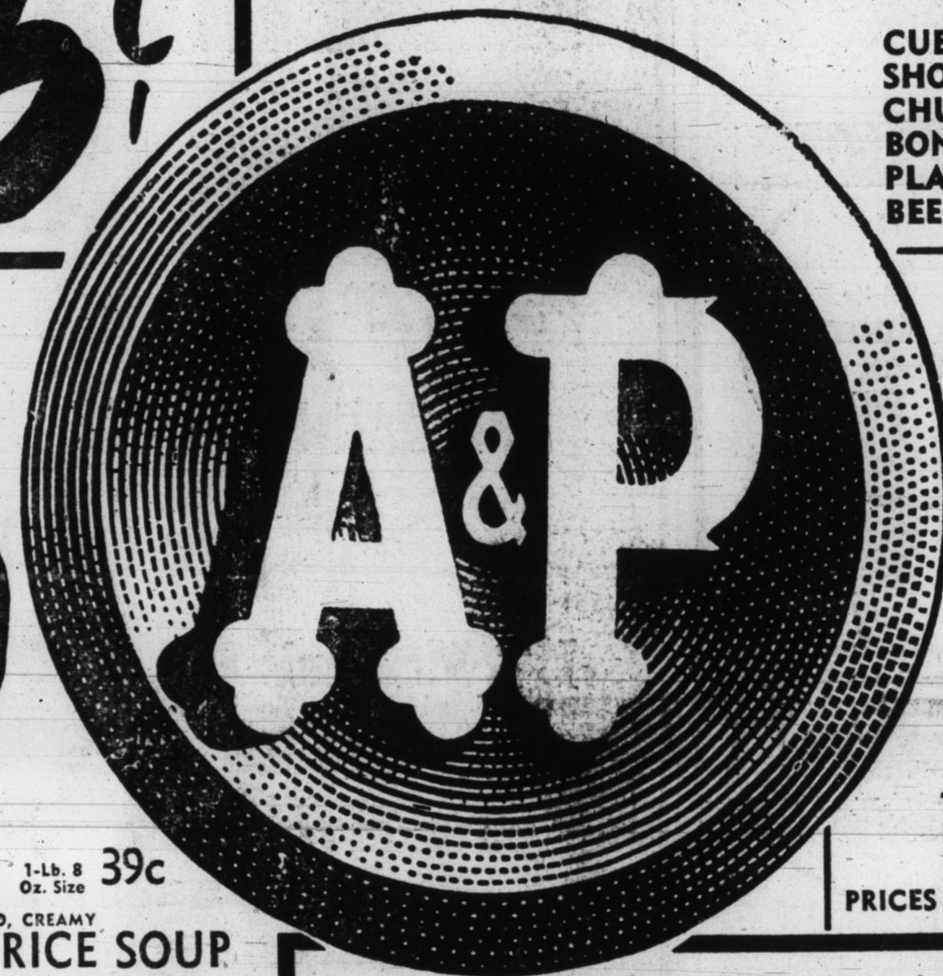

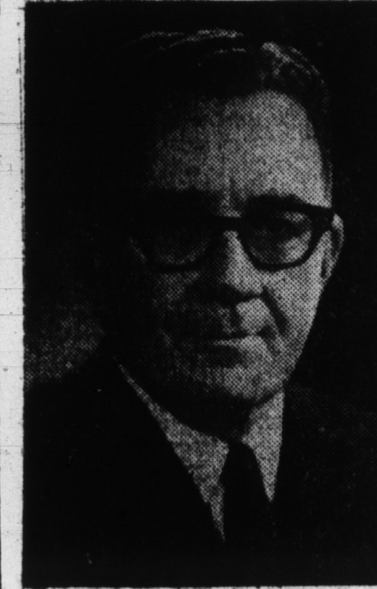

A&P Elects Mr. Christian New President

JACKSONVILLE, FLA. — Directors of the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company's Southern Division today elected J. Gordon Christian Jr. president, succeeding Robert M. Smith, who retired Dec. 31 after 54 years with A & P.

Mr. Christian, formerly executive vice president of the Division, was born in Richmond, Va. He joined the A & P sales staff in his home town in 1922 and four years later was transferred to Charlotte, N. C., then a sub-warehouse of Richmond. When Charlotte was made a Unit in 1927, Mr. Christian became assistant sales manager and served in that capacity until 1928 when he went to Houston, Texas to develop that territory. He served as sales manager in Texas until 1938 when he returned to Charlotte in the same capacity.

In 1955, Mr. Christian was named director of sales for the Southern Division and the following year was promoted to vice president in charge of the New Orleans Unit. He also served as vice president of the Dallas Unit in 1959 and the Charlotte Unit in 1961 before being elected executive vice president of the Southern Division in June 1963.

Mr. Smith, whom Mr. Christian succeeds, was born in Talbot County, Ga. and started as an A & P Store Clerk in 1911 in Atlanta. He later became a store manager and supervisor before being appointed general superintendent of the Jacksonville Unit in 1936. Two years later he was elected vice president in charge of the Jacksonville Unit.

When the Southern Division was established in 1938 to supervise the Company's operations in Florida, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana, Texas, Oklahoma and East Tennessee, Mr. Smith was elected president of the new Division and a director of the parent company. In 1962 he was elected a corporate vice president of the parent organization.

Mr. Smith has been active in various civic and business groups throughout his career and is a director emeritus of the Atlantic National Bank of Jacksonville, director of the First Federal Savings & Loan Association of Jacksonville, the Florida State Chamber of Commerce and the Jacksonville Area Chamber of Commerce. He is also a commissioner of the Housing Authority of Jacksonville.

Duke Endowment Will Aid Churches

DURHAM — Trustees of The Duke Endowment have appropriated \$195,500 to assist 31 rural Methodist churches in North Carolina in financing building projects costing nearly \$1 1/2 million.

The appropriations include \$104,500 to 14 churches in the North Carolina Conference and \$91,000 to 17 churches in the Western North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church.

The money is being used by the churches for a variety of purposes and for projects in various stages of construction. Some have been completed. Twenty-six will use all or part of their funds for new or expanded educational facilities. Others will use theirs for fellowship halls, sanctuaries, a kitchen, a church library, a pastor's study, heating systems, a furnace room, and a renovation program.

In addition to helping in the building programs of churches, The Endowment provides funds for operating expenses and to aid in the support of ministers retired from one of the Conferences and of widows and dependent orphaned children of ministers who served one of them. Trustees handle the work with rural Methodist churches through their Committee on Rural Churches in co-operation with the Rural Church Committee of Duke University, which is composed of representatives of the University and the Divinity School in which its offices are situated. R. Grady Rankin of Gastonia is chairman of the Endowment committee. Members are Norman A. Coker, Thomas F. Hill, and Marshall I. Pickens of Charlotte, Amos P. Kearns of High Point, and Robert McCormack of Scarsdale, N. Y. Thomas L. Perkins of Rye, N. Y., chairman of the Trustees, is an ex officio member. Dr. M. Wilson Nesbitt of Durham is director of the Rural Church work and W. O. Petty, Jr., of Durham, is secretary of the University Committee.

Other areas of The Duke Endowment's philanthropy are higher education, health, and child care in the Carolinas.
