The first meeting of the 4-H Electric Workshop will be held Thursday night, March 3, at 7:30 in the County Office Building.

This workshop is for both boys and girls between ages of 9-19 who are interested in the 4-H Electric Project. Bob Huskey, Agricultural Engineer of Duke Power Company, will be the instructor.

Three additional meetings will be held with classes being held separately for the boys and girls. Miss Rebecca Cheek, Home Service Advisor of Duke Power Company, will be the instructor for the girls.

The second meeting will be held Thursday night, March 10; the third meeting on Tuesday April 5.

During the workshop both the boys and girls will learn about the generation, transmission, distribution and transformation of electricity. The boys will go deeper into the home electrical system and the electric motor while the girls will spend most of their time working with small appliances. Not only will the girls learn how to care for and use the appliances but will be doing some interesting things with the appliances.
