

ceive social security disability in-surance benefits. Am I eligible for Medicare benefits?

A-No. Only persons age 65 on older will be eligible for health insurance benefits. Q—I am 68 years of age and still working. What do I do to qualify for Medicare?

A—You need to apply if you have never applied for social security or railroad retirement benefits. And you should apply by March 31 if you want protec tion under both parts of Medi care when the program starts

Q—I am over 65 and receive social security benefits. If I choose not to sign up for medical insurance at this time, will I have a later opportunity to en

A—Yes There will be a general enrollment period October 1 to December 31, 1967. However, Farm Center at 126 E. Gold your premium rate will be high er if you wait until then to sign

> Q—I am 70 years old and not entitled to social security benefits. I came to the United States 10 years ago, but I am not a citizen. Am I eligible for Medicare? A-As an alien, you can be entitled to health insurance benefits if you were lawfully admitted to the U.S. for permanent residence and have lived in the United States continuously for 5 years just before the month you apply

for health insurance benefits. Q-I am over 65 but have never filed a claim for social security retirement benefits since I earn too much. Will I automatically be eligible for health insur ance benefits?

A—No, you must file a claim. Visit a social security district office and bring your social securty number, an estimate of your earnings for 1965, and some old documentary evidence to show how old you are.

Q_I am 65, but have never worked under social security. Am eligible for health insurance? A-Definitely, but you should get in touch with your social security office as soon as possible. If you do not enroll by March 31, you will not be able to sign up for medical insurance protection until October 1967, and your coverage will not be effective until July 1968. This, of course, means that any medical expense you incur between July 1966 and July 1968 will not be covered by med-


