**The Veterans Corner**

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q—I was recently released from military service. My father runs an auto repair shop. May I take on-the-job training in his shop under the new GI Bill?

A—No. The new GI Bill does not provide assistance for those attending schools such as colleges, universities business, trade or vocational schools.

Q I am a World War II veteran I would like to know some information that is not in my service records, but I know that it is in the company log books of the outfit I was with overseas during World War II. Are these books destroyed or are they kept? If they are kept could you tell me where to write to get the information I want?

A—Write to the Army Records Center, TAGO, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, Mo., making sure you explain in complete detail the information you seek. Give service serial number, date of birth, periods of service.
