

100-Lap Feature Carded For Shelby

SHELBY — The racing programs at Shelby Fairgrounds Speedway get bigger and richer every week. Promoter Clyde Dedmon has scheduled a 100-lap feature for sportsman cars and a 30-lapper for rookies and will pay the winner in the respective divisions \$750 and \$150. That's an increase

of \$150 in the sportsman division and \$25 in the rookie division over the previously biggest and richest program at the half-mile clay track last Saturday.

The Shelby race will start at 8:15 p.m. on Saturday and is expected to draw the usual large and competitive field from the three tracks Dedmon operates in this area.

Roger Ware collected the big prize last week here when he outdistanced Don Beam in the 75-lap feature. It was Ware's first major win of the season here and he is sure to return Saturday for the crack at the bigger prize. Waco's Roger Stroup captured the rookie feature in his 1950 Hudson. Ware drove a 1955 Chevrolet to victory.

Beam, who operates a 1955 Chevrolet out of Cherryville, will also be back in the Shelby field along with such weekend warriors as Charlie Blanton, Preston Humphries and E. G. Adkins.

Beam edged out Blanton in the sportsman feature and Humphries was fourth at Rutherford County Fairgrounds near Spindale last Friday and Humphries collected first place money in a 40-lap feature at Harris Speedway on Sunday afternoon. Blanton, in his trusty 1956 Ford, finished second to the Ford of Humphries at Harris. The Rutherford County card begins at 8:15 p.m. and the Sunday program at Harris starts at 2:30.

Drivers protested the legality of Humphries' winning machine at Harris, but it passed a post-race inspection.

Ross also said that the recreation department is offering a life-saving course and for those interested in taking it should also sign up at the pool.

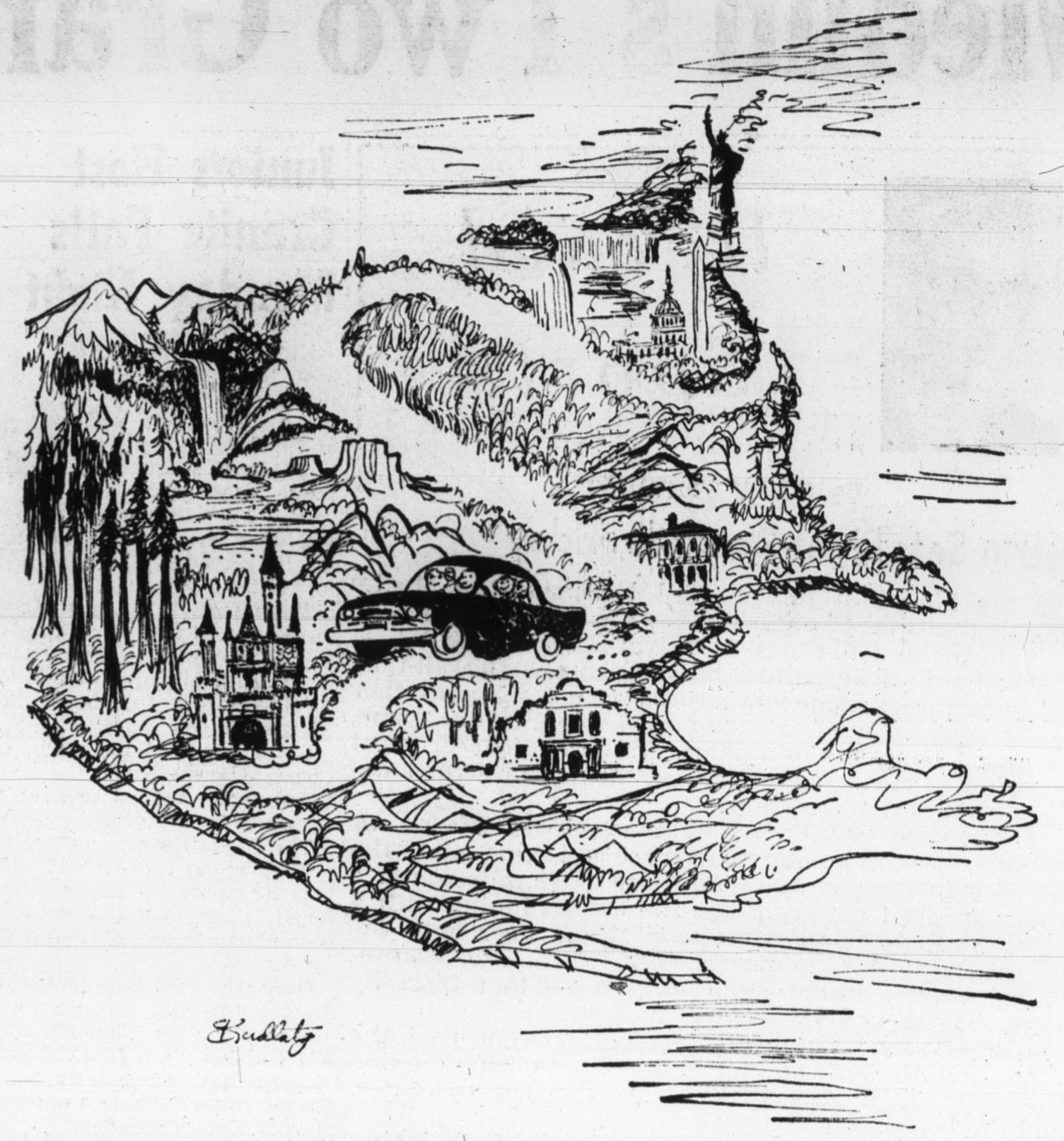
Stadium Bids Due Thursday At 2 P.M.

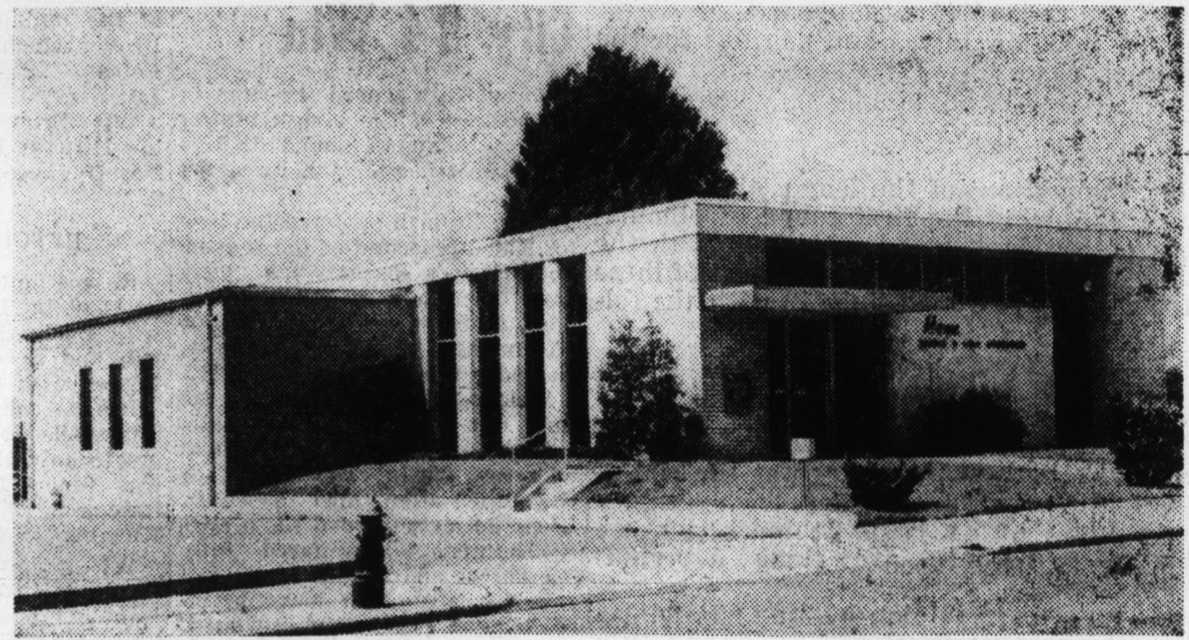
