Apple Growers Vote Wednesday

Wednesday, July 6, is an important date for apple producers in Cleveland County and in other apple producing counties of North Carolina. Apple growers will vote in a "Pennies for Progress" referendum to decide on a self-help program in the promotion of apples. If carried by two-thirds or more of those producers voting, there will be an assessment of three cents per bushel on all apples packaged and sold in closed containers and an assessment of three cents per hundred pounds on all US No. 1 Canners sold to processors, excluding apples sold for juice purposes. The effective period of this assessment will include the years 1966, 1967, and 1968.

Polls will be open from 8:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. at the two polling places in the county. The polling places are (1) the County Agent's Office, County Office Building, Shelby and (2) the Everett Lutz & Son Packing Shed at Belwood.

The owner or leaser of an orchard is eligible to vote. All growers are urged to vote by Cameron Ware, chairman of the County Referendum Committee in this important referendum to decide whether or not to set up an apple promotion program in North Carolina to promote the good apples that are produced in North Carolina.

Everett Lutz is on the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Apple Growers Association which is promoting the "Pennies for Progress" referendum.

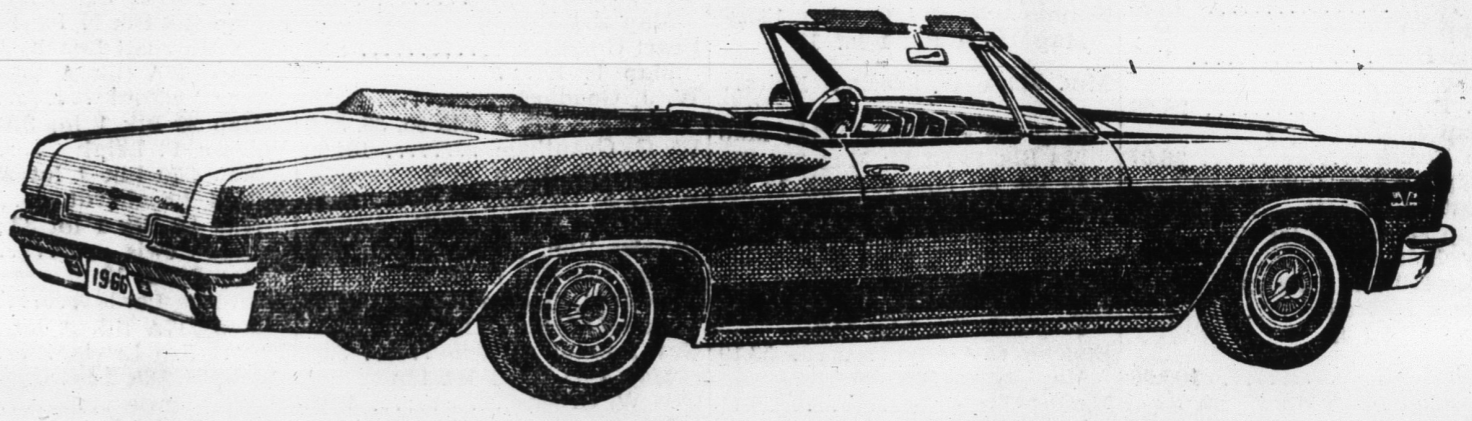
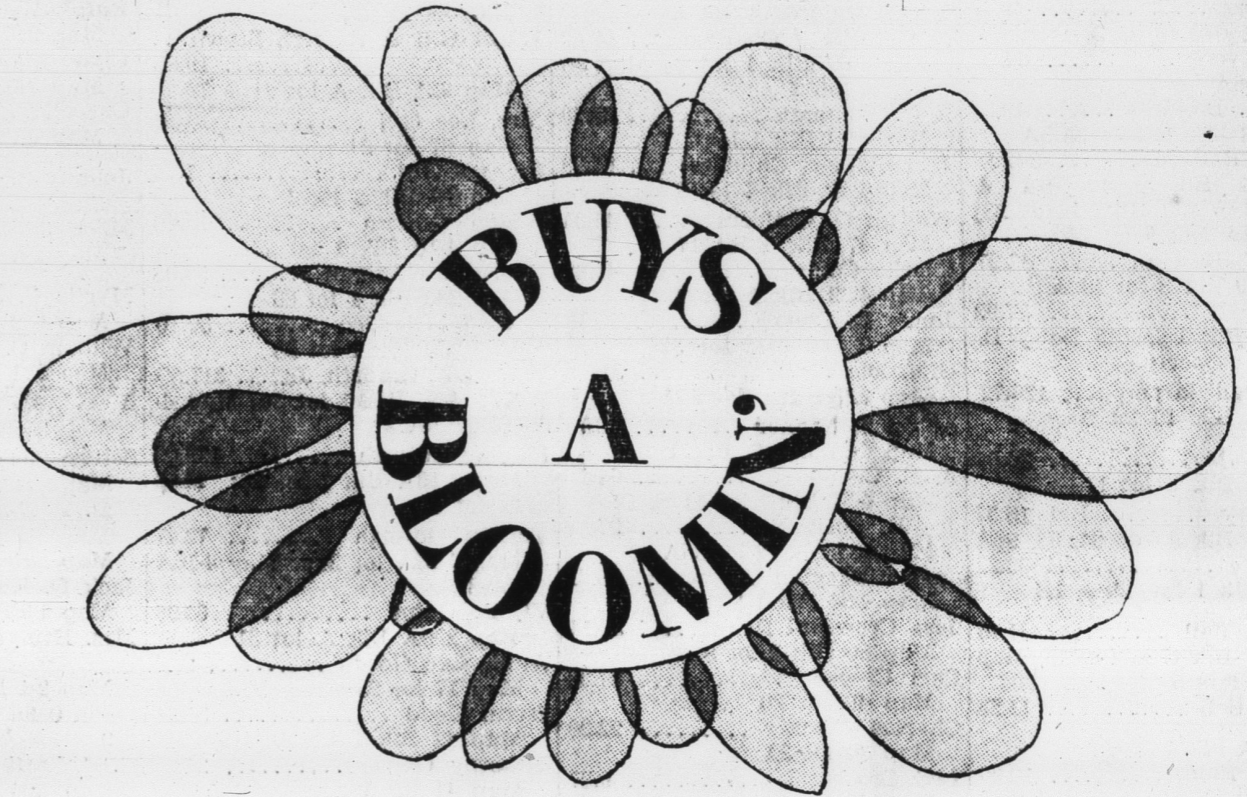

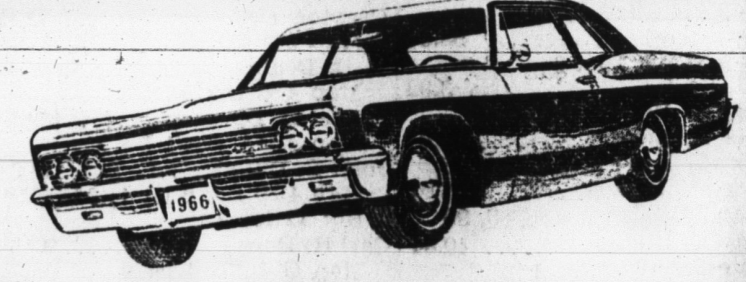
ROTARY CLUB
