







A-Yes. Two years of active service, any part of which was after January 31, 1955, qualifies you. But, you are eligible — month for month — for only that time you have served since that

Q-As a so-called "Six month Enlistee" am I eligible for benefits under the new GI Bill?

Q-I was on active duty from Auguse 19, 1957 to September 20, 1960 Am I eligible for hospital treatment?


