

World Trade Group Meeting

CHARLOTTE — Representatives of 10 nations will participate in "A Salute to International Business" at the White House Inn here February 9, Leon Moody, president of the sponsoring North Carolina World Trade Association, announced today.

The world trade meeting opens with a 12:30 luncheon, with two consecutive panel discussions starting at 2:30 o'clock. There will be a reception at 6:30 and a banquet at 7:30 p.m. The meeting is open to companies involved or interested in world trade.

Each of the 10 panelists will

make brief comments on trade between his country and North Carolina, and a question and answer period will follow. They are: Andre DeSchutter, economic attache, Belgian Embassy; O. Blato, commercial secretary, Brazilian Embassy; Flemming Ageup, minister counselor and deputy chief of mission, Danish Embassy; Jean Fourcade, assistant commercial counselor, French Embassy;

Willie Fritch, counselor for economic affairs, West German Embassy; Philip Ridley, commercial counselor, British Embassy; Ugo

Marabito, commercial minister, Italian Embassy; Antoni G. O. Smit, first commercial secretary, Netherlands Embassy, and W. Lubbe, economics counselor, South African Embassy. A representative of Japan will be announced later.

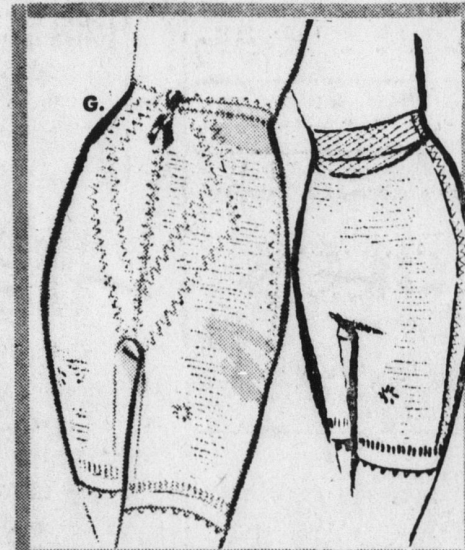
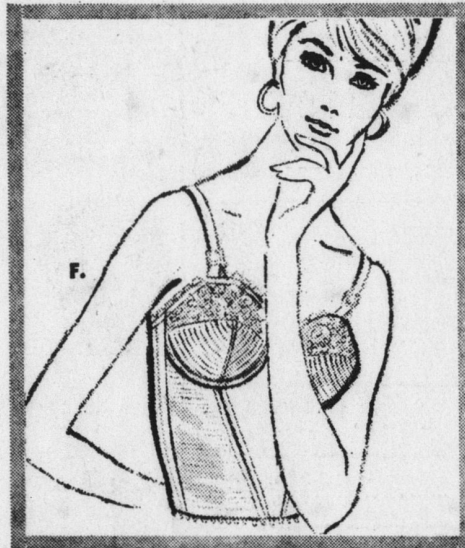
