A-Effective Jan. 1, 1969, income limitations, which govern financial eligibility for VA pensions and dependency benefits, will be raised \$200 for all benefits. ficiaries. This increase is particularly important to "old law" pensioners since it will mean that the recent Social Security inome hike will cause no loss in VA payments.

Q-How wil Ithe \$100 increments in the new Veterans Administration pension structure which goes into effect next January affect pension rates?

A-Basically, the \$100 incre-ments in the new VA pension structure will mean that maximum VA pension and dependency and indemnity compensation benefits will go to veteran, wid-ows and parents with the lowest ncome. For example, under current law, the monthly VA pension for a veteran with one dependent and an annual income of \$1.00 to \$1,000 is \$109. However, the restructed pension program will provide payments ranging from \$120 a month for an income of \$500 or less to \$109 a month for an annual income of \$900 to \$1,-000. And VA monthly pension benefits will be reduced an average of only \$3 or \$4 for each \$100 increase in income up to the new
