### Mrs. Nance's Rites Conducted

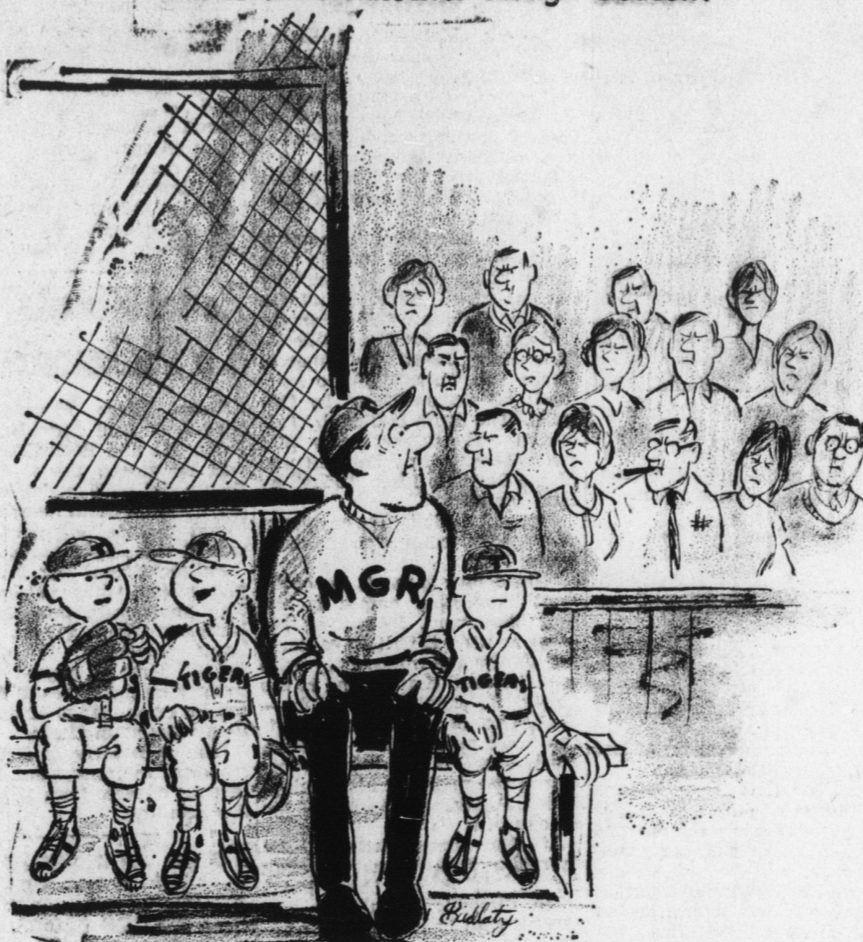

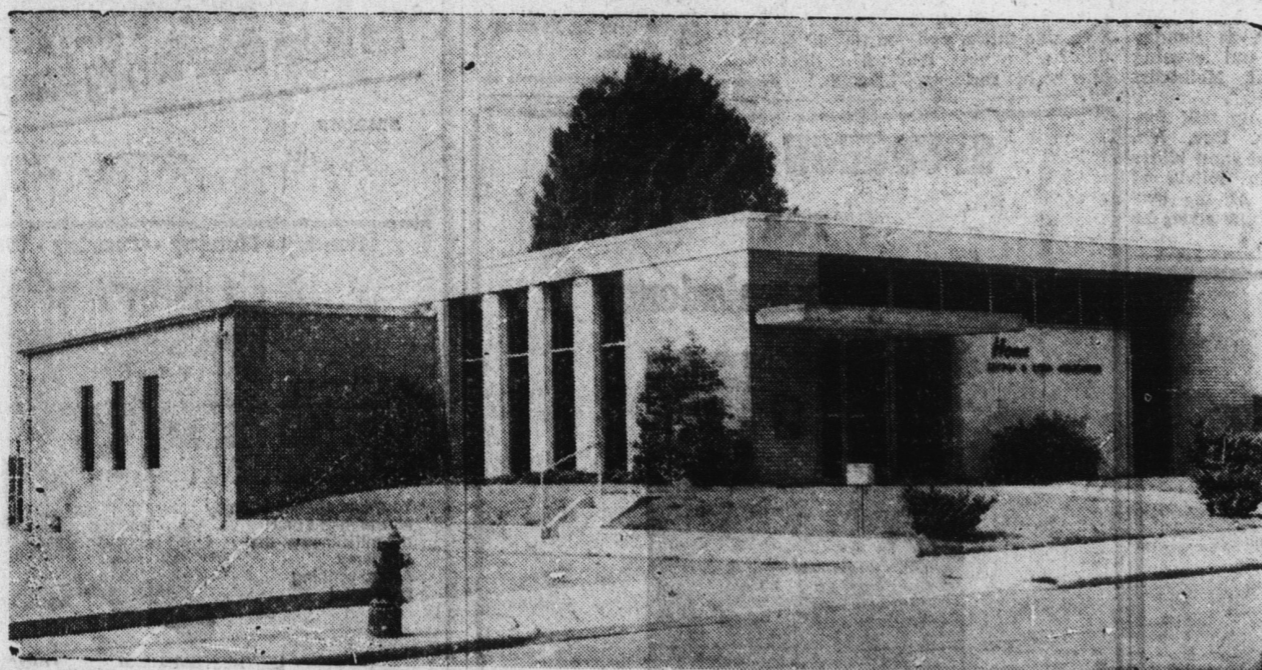

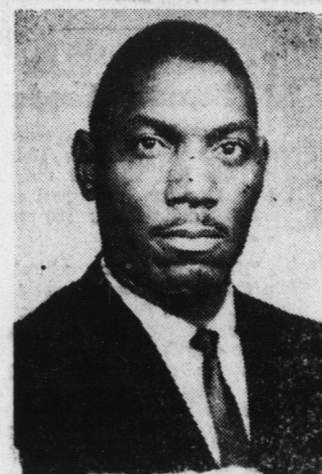
