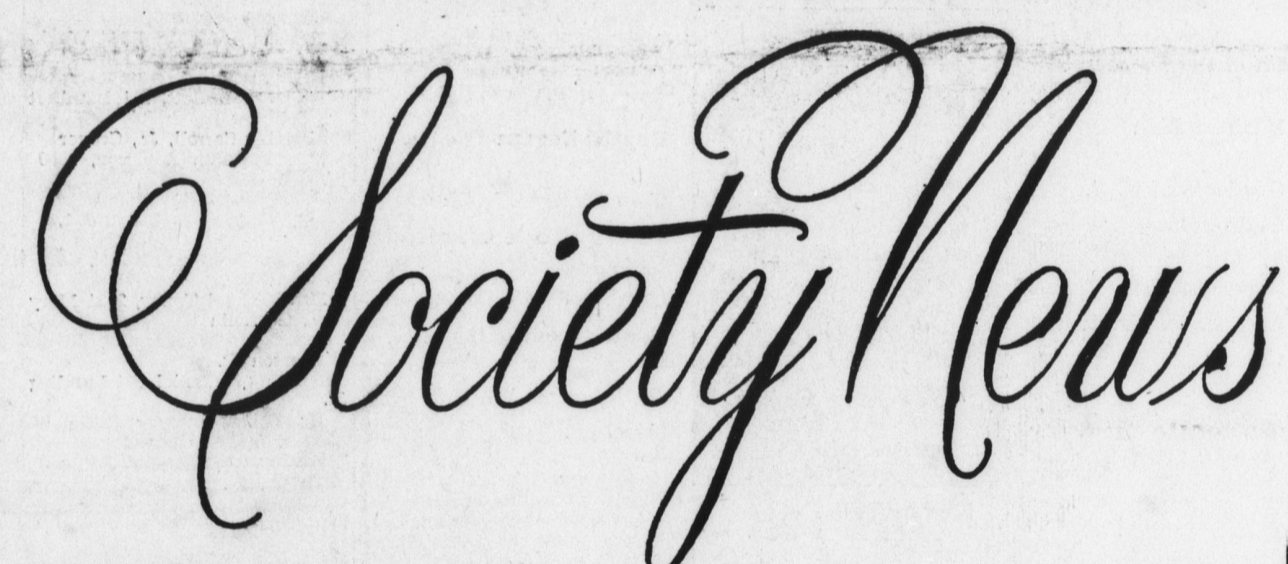

### Meat, Seafood, Poultry Recipes Feature "Favorite Recipes" By N. C. Good Cooks

Meat, seafood and poultry can be prepared in many ways to enhance their natural goodness and to conserve their nutritive value. The good cooks in North Carolina have many of these favorite recipes they have included in a meat edition of "Favorite Recipes of the Carolinas" published by Favorite Recipes Press, Box 3396, Montgomery, Alabama. The book contains 600 recipes from women's club leaders in the Carolinas and is a companion to dessert edition also made available to clubwomen in the state.

Here are some samples: **CHICKEN PIEDMONT**  
Two 2 to 2½ lb. fryers, cut up 2 cups milk Salt, pepper and flour Butter or corn oil

Soak fryers in milk for two hours. Drain and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and flour. Brown on both sides in butter. Remove chicken from fat; place in baking dish. Bake at 350 degrees until done. **SAUCE**  
2 tbsp. drippings or butter 1 tsp. flour 2 cups milk 8 ripe olives, chopped ½ cup sliced mushrooms ½ cup water chestnuts Brown flour in drippings; slowly add milk and cook to make smooth sauce. Add olives, mushrooms, and water chestnuts. Serve with chicken. Yield: 6-8 servings.

**BARBECUED WIENERS**  
½ onion, chopped 1 tsp. butter Dash of black pepper 4 tsp. sugar 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce ½ cup catsup 2 cups water ¼ cup vinegar 1 lb. wieners, cooked Sauté onion in butter; add remaining ingredients. Split wieners down middle; place in baking dish. Pour sauce over wieners. Bake at 400 degrees for 15-20 minutes. Yield: 6-8 servings.
