DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
36% of the Tax Levy has been voted by the people.

Fallston Fire District	\$ 4,988.36
Special School District Taxes	357,454.66
Debt Service—All Purposes	\$1,236,845.92

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
On short-term investments of funds not immediately needed for the purpose collected, Cleveland County will earn a little more than \$112,000.00 in the fiscal year 1967-1968. This is more than the total interest paid on countywide bonds.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
Something new has been added to Kings Mountain . . . banks that now have more than a million dollars on deposit of county money.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The County collects all school taxes, including district taxes . . . then it is turned over to the schools.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
A record of all disbursements of county funds is kept in the office of the County Auditor and any item may be examined at any time by any taxpayer of Cleveland County.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
Article V of the North Carolina Constitution states: "Commissioners can not contract any debt in excess of two thirds of the amount by which the existing debt was reduced the next previous year without a vote of the people."

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The percentages of the total tax levy including county-wide levy and special school district taxes are:

County-Wide Levy	
County Schools	56%
Shelby Schools	62%
Kings Mountain	58%

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The County Commissioners have no choice but to build a new County Jail. If some action is not taken in the near future, the present jail will be condemned and the County instructed to build a new one under a court order.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The present court facility (former Courthouse) is inadequate for the new court system and serves only temporarily.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
In the Cleveland Community Action program 565 high school students have found employment opportunities.
53 college students received summer employment.
200 family units were engaged in a total "self-help" program.
1100 students participated in the school systems' "Head Start" program

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The State and Federal Government participates as follows in the Public Welfare Program in comparison to Cleveland County:

State & Federal	County
Administrative	57.4% 42.52%
Old Age Assistance	87.8% 12.20%
Aid to Families with Dependent Children	88.8% 11.20%
Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled	77.8% 22.20%
Medical Aid to the Aged	86.28% 13.72%

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
In compliance with the law, the tentative budget estimate of Cleveland County for each fiscal year is filed with the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners where it remains for public inspection for twenty (20) days prior to its final adoption by the County Commissioners. A notice will be published in the local news media as to when the budget is available for public inspection on the Clerk's desk.

DID YOU KNOW THAT . . .
The Cleveland County Technical Institute has 85 to 90 persons enrolled in the high school completion program.
Also, there were over 1,600 persons who participated in one or more of 27 different courses at Cleveland Tech during the year 1966-1967. Additionally, all of this is for less than \$.01 of the tax rate.

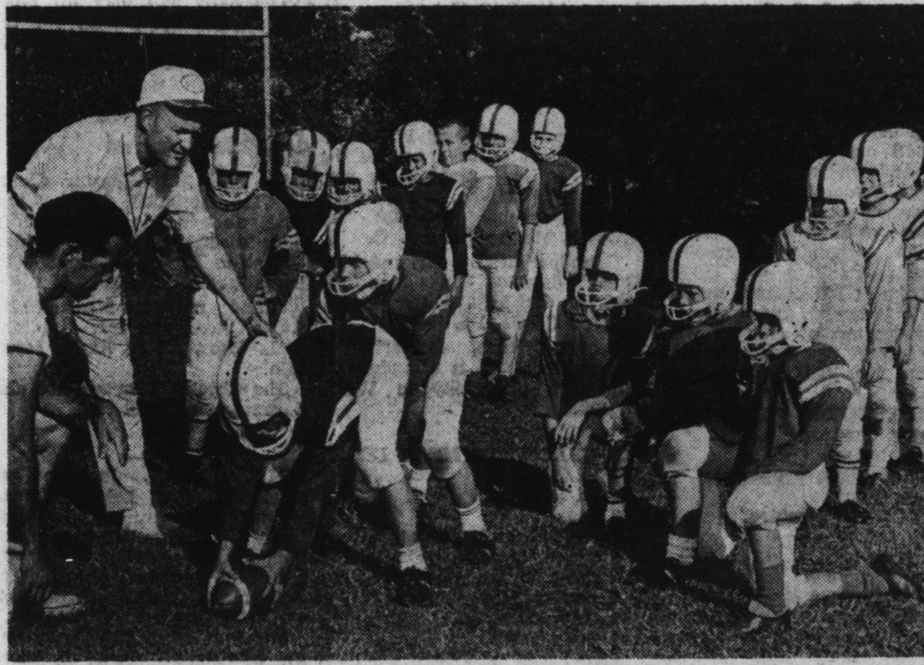

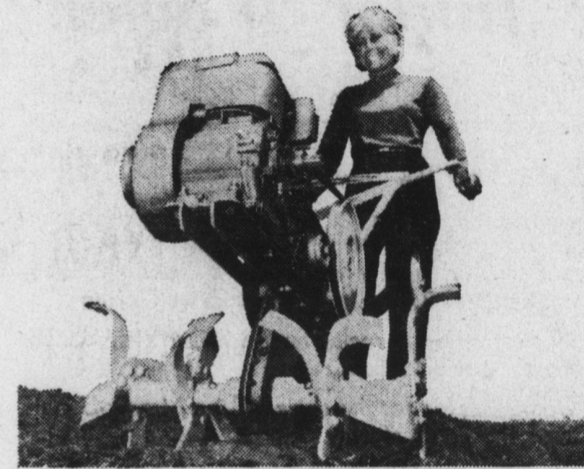
