NASHVILLE — State Democratic Chairman I. T. Valentine, Jr. today urged North Carolina Democrats to attend their precinct meetings, to be held across the State this Saturday, May 11.

Valentine stated that each precinct committee has been increased from five to ten members, thereby adding 10,955 precinct committee members. The precinct committees will elect delegates to the County Convention, and, where appropriate, will elect new chairmen and vice chairmen in the precincts.

The enlargement of precinct committees is a part of the State Democratic Party's new Plan of Organization, which was approved in January at the State Democratic Executive Committee meeting.

Valentine said that good attendance at Saturday's precinct meetings is imperative to the success of the Fall election.
