Riley Mayberry

Johnny Laws, 17, who pleaded guilty to the February robbery charge, is serving a seven-year term in a federal establishment for juvenile offenders.

Kings Mountain Police Chief Tom McDevitt and Officer Bill Roper arrested Riley and Mayberry on I-85 less than an hour after the Blacksburg bank was robbed of \$15,128.88.

The chain of events began Saturday at 11:15 a.m. when two men entered the Grover bank and robbed it at gunpoint. Following the robbery, area police were alerted and Kings Mountain Police Chief Tom McDevitt, off-duty officer William Roper and State Highway Patrolman J. L. Evans headed toward Grover on I-85.

The trio of officers had stopped Mrs. Thurman Gantt on I-85 and were questioning her at the time a 1964 model black and white auto sped by. The three officers gave chase that later resulted in the arrest of Riley and Mayberry after two pistol shots were fired by officers and a short foot race up a dirt bank and across a plowed field ended. A bag full of money was recovered at this point and a pistol was taken from Riley, according to police.

The two men were taken to Kings Mountain where they were turned over to FBI agents, who continued the investigation with the aid of Kings Mountain police. Police investigation revealed that Mrs. Gantt and her husband were not married at the time of the first bank robbery.

Mrs. Elizabeth Hammett told police she was standing behind the teller's cage in the bank when two men entered Saturday. She said she was serving a customer and the two men stood by to await their turn. "After the customer left", according to Mrs. Hammett, one of the men pulled a gun and ordered me and the bank manager, W. E. Troublefield, to lie down on the floor of the bank. "The older of the two men did all the talking", she said.

Troublefield said one of the men went to the vault and one went to the cash drawers at the teller's window. "It was all over in three to five minutes", said Mrs. Hammett.

Dr. Ausley's sermon topic Sunday night will be "Unity" from John 17: 6-23.



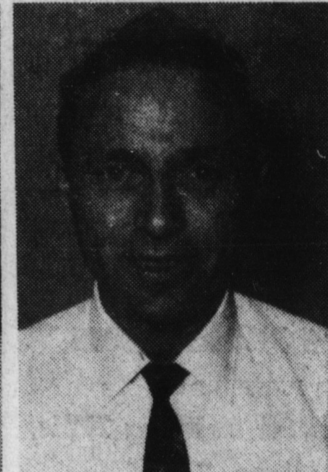

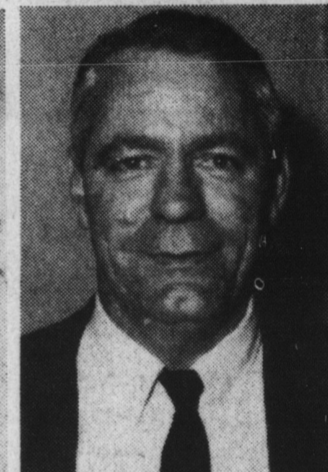

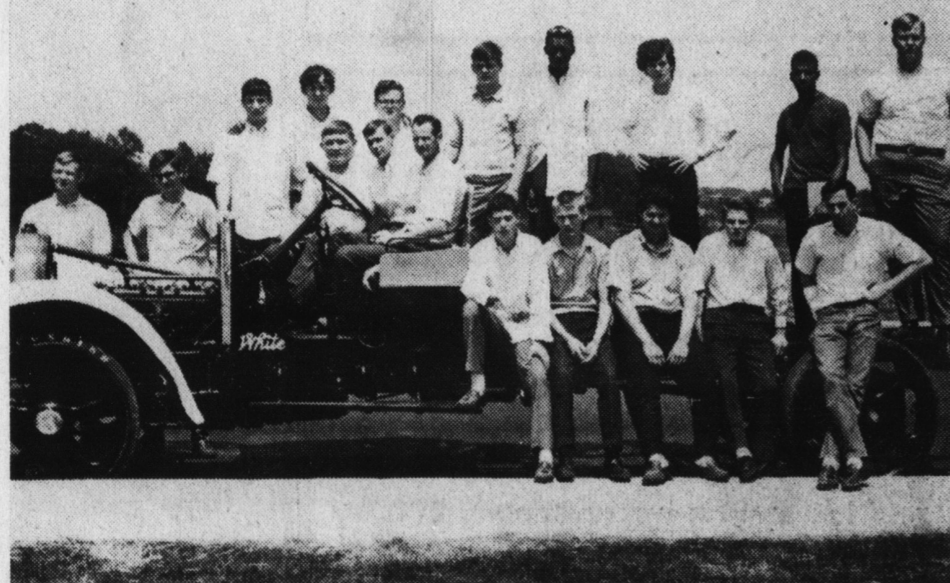
