Summer Theatre Is Featuring Familiar Stars

Among the actors returning for the Charlotte Summer Theatre's ninth consecutive season at Owens Auditorium will be top featured players Ken Cantril, Charlotte Fairchild and Rowena Rollins. The season begins July 9 with Sam Levene starring in the Woody Allen comedy hit "Don't Drink the Water."

As Emile de Beque, Mr. Cantril plays to Jane Kean's Nellie Forbush in "South Pacific, the first musical offering of the season opening July 15 and running through July 21. During the latter part of the season, Mr. Cantril becomes Captain von Trapp in "The Sound of Music" which stars Patrice Munsel. The handsome baritone is well known to Piedmont residents both for his appearances at the Charlotte Summer Theatre and for his guest spots with the Charlotte Choral Society.

Versatile Charlotte Fairchild, who played such diverse roles last season as Rosie in "Bye Bye Birdie," Marian in "The Music Man," Janice Dayton in "Silk Stockings" and Daisy Gamble in "On a Clear Day you Can See Forever," will enact Julie in "Showboat," opening July 23. Immediately following this, she will have the lead opposite Bill Hayes in "Pajama Game," opening July 30 and playing through August 4.

Having recovered from last season's sixth-floor walk-up in "Barefoot in the Park," Rowena Rollins rejoins CST to play three choice parts: Mrs. Higgins in "My Fair Lady," opening August 13, Parthy Ann in "Showboat" and Mabel, the ubiquitous secretary in "Pajama Game." Miss Rollins will also be remembered as Mrs. Brice, "Funny Girl's" mother.

In addition to "Don't Drink the Water," "South Pacific," "Showboat," "Pajama Game," "The Sound of Music" and "My Fair Lady," the season features Betty Johnson in "Fanny's Rainbow," and Edd Byrnes, Diane McBain and Carleton Carpenter in Neil Simon's "Star Spangled Girl." As a pre-season enticement to ticket buyers, subscriptions may be purchased at the Owens Auditorium box office daily from 10 - 6 p.m. Charlotte Summer Theatre supporters who buy subscriptions to all eight star-studded shows are guaranteed choice seats at attractive prices. Exchange coupon books are also available for savings during the summer season.
