Mr. Neisler is president of the local club.

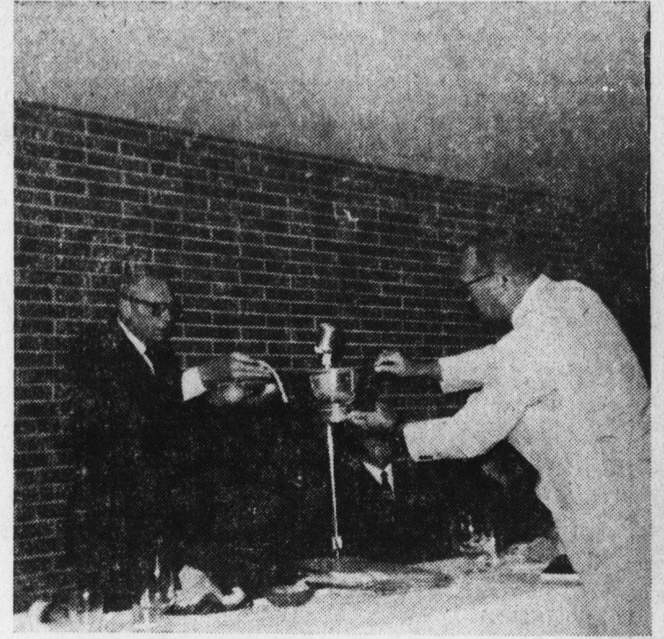
ABOUT THIS 'N THAT
