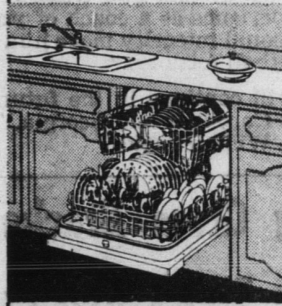
**Howell Holland's Brother Passes**

**Weed Killers Replacing Hoe And The Plow**

Chemical weed killers are replacing the hoe and plow in the home garden just as they have in many commercial farm crops. The key to using herbicides in the garden successfully is knowing which material to select and how to use it, according to Dr. Walter A. Skroch, extension horticultural specialist at North Carolina State University. "We know enough about chemical weed control now to make it feasible to treat a major portion of our vegetable gardens using one or two weed control chemicals and eliminating much of the hand hoeing," Dr. Skroch said. He added that the gardener shouldn't approach the use of chemical weed control materials with the idea that he can buy one herbicide and use it indiscriminately all over the garden. "I know of no herbicide that can be safely and effectively used on all vegetable crops," Skroch said. "However, it is possible to get good weed and grass control with a minimum of two materials."

**Scholarship Deadline Near**

Raleigh — Applications for the Prospective Teacher Scholarship Loan Fund, a program created by the 1957 General Assembly to encourage students to train as teachers, must be submitted no later than March 1, 1969. Students interested in teaching in the North Carolina public schools and who are in need of financial assistance for college training during the 1969-70 school year should write to: Scholarship Section, Division of Teacher Education, Department of Public Instruction, Raleigh 27602. According to Morris C. Brown, supervisor of the Teacher Scholarship Loan Program Loan Program, about 600 awards will be made in March and April. Each recipient will receive \$600 per year for up to four years of study. "Priority will be given to applicants who plan to teach in elementary grades; however, other areas of study will be considered," he said.
