traffic locations recently by the listed were: Traffic Engineering Department of the North Carolina State Highway Commission.

The engineers, after months of study, issued a report listing 225 US 74 Business east of Shelby, intersections, 54 traffic concentra-tion points, 15 bridges, 22 sections and 12 railroad crossing, which have high aaccident frequencies. All of the points listed are outside incorporated cities and towns, the report said.

Each such high accident location, the engineer said, will be investigated for possible improvement by engineering action.
