


Cole, in breaking his personal high of 36 in addition to Adams' school record, hit for 15 field goals and nine of 12 free throws as the Mountaineers blazed to their ninth straight victory over

a Lincolnton squad.

Cole dropped in 27 points in the second half after scoring only 12 in the first two periods. He ac complished the record feat while sitting out a goodly portion of the game, as Coach Bob Hussey substituted freely.
