Caution children against the dangers of fire. In case of a clothing fire, warn them not to run or remain standing, but to drop down and roll on the ground. If indoors, drop to the floor and roll into a rug to smother the flames. If no rug is handy, a heavy coat or wool blanket will do. Jumping under the shower or spraying with a garden hose is effective. It is wise to keep a garden hose attached and coiled both indoors and outdoors.
