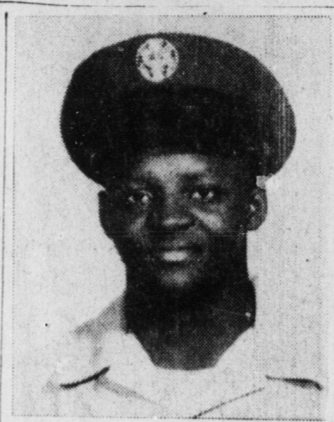

Witnesses Set Convention in Charlotte

Jehovah's Witnesses of Gastonia are having a share in the giant search for rooms for the more than 12,000 delegates who will be going to Charlotte for the "Men of Goodwill" District Assembly of the organization. The convention will be held July 9-12 at the Coliseum. Witnesses from Gastonia are working with around 600 Witnesses from 17 congregations in the Charlotte vicinity calling at the homes of Charlotte housewives to list rooms for visiting delegates.

Herbert W. Elam, resident minister of the local congregation, announced that the gathering will include delegates from North and South Carolina, parts of Virginia, Kentucky, and Tennessee, as well as from other distant points. This will be one of 46 conventions that the Watchtower Society will sponsor throughout the United States and Canada during 1970.

One of the highlights of the gathering will be the public address, "Saving the Human Race — in the Kingdom Way," to be given at 3 p.m., Sunday, July 12th. Morning, afternoon and evening sessions will be featured at the Coliseum.

Many local Witnesses from Gastonia are working in the various assembly departments in preparation for the seminar.

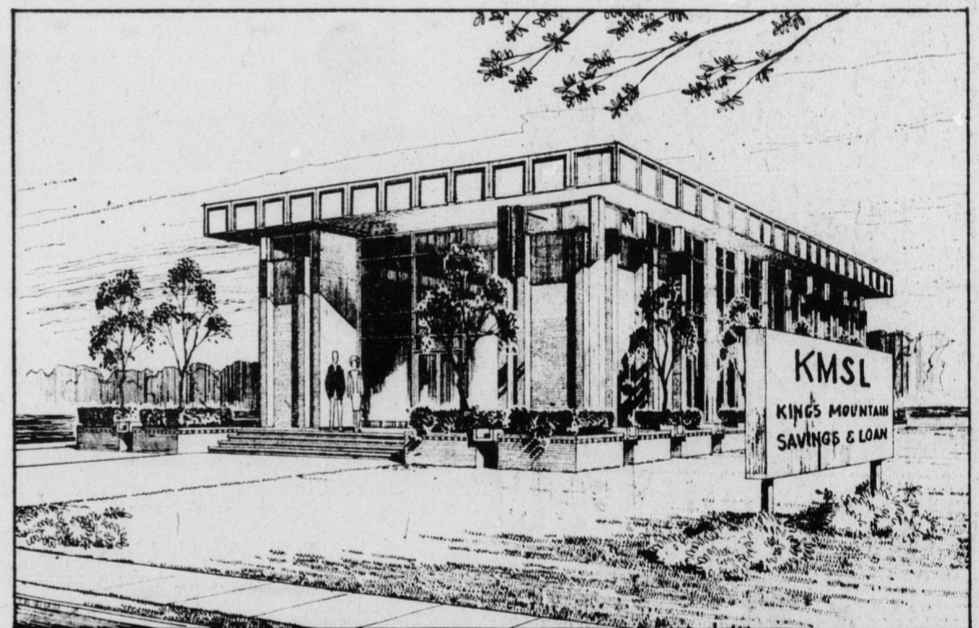
