

### Fair Later, October 6-10

The Cleveland County fair will be later this year, the week of October 6-10.

This year's fair is about a week later than the fair last year, says Elbridge Lee Weathers, fair manager.

The reason for the delayed date is a little obscure. It appears to be due to a cyclical cause which recurs every 7 years setting the fair date back, but this is the latest the fair has been held in its 47 year history.

Another factor, the other large state fairs are also being held later this year. Cleveland's is the largest county fair in the southeast and probably the largest county fair in the U. S.

The decision regarding the date the fair will be held is jointly made between Mr. Weathers and the carnival group, Deggeler Amusement Co.

Next year the fair will probably return to a September schedule and can arrive as early as September 20, according to Mr. Weathers. But every 7 years this delayed fair date comes around, he explains. Regarding this cyclical phenomenon he notes that the date of the days on a 1914 calendar he has in his office coincide with 1970's dates and days.

The 57 acre county owned fairground is reasonably quiet and deserted during the year except for Saturday night when auto races are held May 1 to Sept. 1 and the four times yearly when the barn is used for county and state cattle sales. (Construction is to begin on a new barn soon) Mr. Weathers reports money has been laid away for the barn each year.

If the fair ceases to be an agricultural fair, the property reverts to the county except for 7 additional adjoining acres owned by the fair stockholders. The fair stockholders constitute a non-profit group. The amusement company pays them a certain percentage and is lucky to take away 10% amusement officials report. The carnival people reportedly spend a lot of money in the county during their brief stay, especially on clothes and gas for the rides and this economic boost the county receives is reportedly the reason the fair was established. It was the idea of Mr. Weathers and the late Dr. J. S. Dorton.

Mr. Weathers does not divulge the total amount of money the fair grossed last year nor the percentage of profit the amusement company gets. Any profits support fairground improvements. James B. Strates Shows were the amusement group for many years.

To get the fair underway, stock was sold at \$20 a share. Only 800 shares were issued and many of the original stockholders retain their stock. The Kiwanis Club promoted the fair originally and Mr. W. K. Mauney was one of the original directors. Occasionally fair stock is sold at estate sales. Mr. Weathers says, it has never sold for less nor more than \$20 and a dividend has never been issued. However, each shareholder

### Bumgardner Is Tutor

Gaither Bumgardner of 5050 Midpines in Kings Mountain, a Mars Hill senior, is a tutor counselor in chorus and piano for the college's Upward Bound program for high school students who have shined aside their books and pencils or the summer to get involved in the social and economic life of North Carolina's Southern Appalachian region.

They are at Mars Hill college for "Summer '70," the name given to the college's second summer internship program and the largest in the region.

After orientation sessions they were given 12-week assignments in 20 different governmental and

private agencies for tasks ranging from setting up day-care centers and recreation programs to pollution and industrial surveys, from evaluation of agency planning methods to coordination of political campaigns.

The program is one of a dozen in which Mars Hill uses the Southern Appalachian region as a campus to combine teaching and learning with meaningful service in an approach called "service-learning." The college is located in the mountains of Madison County, federal classified as one of the nation's 256 poorest counties, and 20 miles from Asheville, boyhood home of novelist Thomas Wolf and the site of one of the nation's 100 Model Cities programs.

The interns receive \$840 stipends, plus travel allowance, for their services, and six hours of

academic credit for independent studies papers.

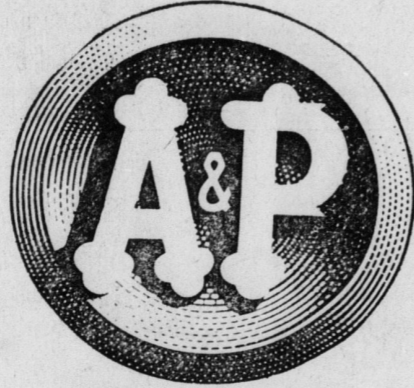
The program is funded by the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW), the Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) and by matching grants from the college and participating agencies. The \$20,000 HEW grant was obtained through the State Board of Higher Education under provisions of Title I of the Higher Education Act of 1965; the \$5,000 grant, through the N. C. State Planning Task Force.
