KMHS Teacher Back-To-School Jackie Chaney, Charles Ross Give Plans

Mrs. Brenda Neal has been teaching Journalism for two years at Kings Mountain high school with no formal journalism education, and felt "I have been cheating my students." The Newspaper Fund and the University of South Carolina School of Journalism offered her the opportunity to change this Journalism Workshop, June 15-26. Because of the proximity of the location and the credit offered, she applied. Mrs. Neal, who also teaches senior English at Kings Mountain, received her B.A. in English at Winthrop college in Rock Hill, and her M.A.T. in English at Converse college in Spartanburg. The Newspaper Fund is sponsored by the Wall Street Journal to encourage better scholastic journalism. Twelve workshops similar to the one held at the University of South Carolina are being conducted throughout the United States this summer. This workshop accepted 21 teachers from the Eastern United States - Massachusetts, Indiana, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York, Arkansas, Tennessee, North Carolina and South Carolina itself. Almost all of the teachers were lacking in journalism education. Seven hours each day were spent in classes, where special emphasis was placed on copy editing; news, feature and editorial writing; and specific problems of the high school newspaper. The teachers were given ample opportunity to practice their own skills in each area of discussion. The two-week calendar included more than work. The first evening of the workshop ended with a barbecue sponsored by the staff of the school of journalism. Tours of varied local areas, including a meal atop the Capstone Tower, were offered. The weekend included a trip to Charleston. Even without planned activities, the teachers entertained one another with talk about school, school, and more school. When asked how she felt about journalism, Mrs. Neal said, "It's a wide-open career field for young people who are interested in words and people." Mrs. Neal and her husband, Charles, make their home at Rt. 1, Grover.
