Model House On Display At State Fair

RALEIGH — Persons interested in a low-to-moderate cost house that offers plenty of floor and "look of today," may find just what they want at the North Carolina State Fair.

A model house designed by the Community Development Group, School of Design, North Carolina State University, offers 990 square feet of living space, excluding the front porch.

It is 24 feet square and designed to provide comfort through natural ventilation.

The house is designed in two levels, with the children's bedrooms and play area on the second floor, and the parents' bedroom and general living space on the first floor.

Rooms are efficiently planned to eliminate excessive corridor space.

The exterior siding panels can be finished in many available colors or with a PVF film surface. Henry Sanoff, NCSU professor and head of the project, said the School of Design was approached by an Eastern Carolina firm two years ago and asked to design a house that: 1) could be built in a factory and put together on a lot, 2) that would be within the income reach of families eligible for government subsidies in housing, and 3) that would offer special design features usually found only in higher priced houses.

The house being built on the State Fair grounds answers these requirements.

There are a couple other unique things about the State Fair Demonstration house.

The entire house was built by 30 high school students enrolled in a vocational education program at Fingert's Marina. They constructed sections of the house in the class room, hauled them to the State Fair site on two trucks, and proceeded to "put up" the house in two days.

The high school students will be putting the finishing touches on the inside of the house during State Fair, so visitors will have a chance to see them at work.

There's another reason why we welcome the chance to build on the State Fair grounds, Sanoff indicated. The house has a unique design and it's hard for people to understand a unique house if they haven't seen it.

The demonstration house will give thousands of fair goers a chance to see and react to a unique house.

Sanoff said the house would be open to visitors for one year.
