## Board Approves Lunch Program

The Kings Mountain Board of Education Monday night formally approved a new free and reduced price lunch program in the district system. The new program, which is going into effect statewide, is the result of the National School Lunch Act passed last summer by Congress and makes it possible for a family of four with an income of \$3,720 or less and only three children to receive the free meals. Supt. Donald Jones said the only essential differences in the new program and the one already in effect is that all children will be furnished an application for free lunches whether they plan to actually apply or not. Lunch tickets will be kept in individual classrooms, Jones said, for the convenience of students who wish to charge their lunch or have forgotten their lunch money, as well as for the needy child getting free lunches.

RALEIGH — As you shop this fall, you'll find colors in women's fashions seem to emphasize the heather, funky or dusty tones.
