Board Approves Lunch Program

The Kings Mountain Board of Education Monday night formally approved a new free and reduced price lunch program in the district system.

The new program, which is going into effect statewide, is the result of the National School Lunch Act passed last summer by Congress and makes it possible for a family of four with an income of \$3,720 or less and only three children to receive the free meals.

Supt. Donald Jones said the only essential differences in the new program and the one already in effect is that all children will be furnished an application for free lunches whether they plan to actually apply or not.

Lunch tickets will be kept in individual classrooms, Jones said, for the convenience of students who wish to charge their lunch or have forgotten their lunch money, as well as for the needy child getting free lunches.

IRS Does Not Sell Name Lists

Greensboro — J. E. Wall, District Director of Internal Revenue, said today that the IRS does not "sell" name lists of federal taxpayers as described recently in several state newspaper editorials.

Wall said that there is probably some confusion over the fact that the Congress long ago approved a system of tax information exchange between federal and State governments. He said, federal tax information given to State tax authorities for official use is controlled by a strict federal law which imposes heavy penalties for anyone divulging it to others.

A fee is charged the State based strictly on the man-hour cost for producing the information. A "sale" is not involved. The cost is recovered to protect the federal taxpayer's dollar.

Wall also said that certain statistical information is available for purchase from the U. S. Government Printing Office by anyone. These statistics provide data on very large groups of people and organizations according to zip code locations in each state. "No information on any individual or single organization is available in these statistics," Wall said.

Wall said that under federal statute it would be unlawful for any private individual or organization to be provided with a listing of taxpayers for the purpose of producing mass mailing lists, as has been charged in some news media editorials.

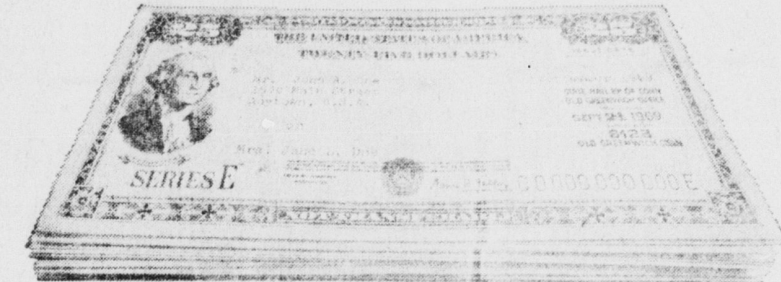
The show will be staged at the Woman's club and curtain time is 8 p.m.
