From them have come improved understanding and new facilities in many communities of the District.

Jim Broyhill has served as a member of the House Republican Policy Committee in which he has helped frame national policies for his party. He is now the Republican Regional Whip exercising an important leadership role among the nineteen Republican Congressmen in the six Southeastern States.
