
Parents of the two honorees will entertain at a Sweet Sixteen semi-formal dance from 8:30 until midnight that evening at Kings Mountain Country club.

## Shelby Church Rites Unite Blantons; Couples Set Their Wedding Dates

Shelby's First Baptist church was the setting Saturday evening for a formal eight o'clock candlelight wedding uniting Miss Kathryn Lee Queen of Shelby and Henry Boyd Blanton, II, of Spartanburg, S. C.

The bride, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Edd Queen of Shelby, is granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. Glenn White of Kings Mountain.

The couple pledged vows of the double-ring ceremony before the Rev. Gene Watterson, minister of the church.

Mrs. Hubert Plaster was organist and Van Ramsey was vocalist for the program of nuptial music.

In the sanctuary a pyramid of candles lighted the area in the open baptistry which was banked with greenery, and a mammoth sunburst of yellow, gold and cream chrysanthemums, pompons and gladioli was placed on a fluted pedestal just beneath the candle pyramid. Crescent candelabra holding fifteen lighted tapers stood at each side of the central arrangement and these were garlanded with smilax entwined with loops of gold velvet bows. Smilax with gold velvet bows enhanced the altar rail and also formed a garland around the baptistry. Cathedral candlesticks entwined with smilax, chrysanthemums and velvet ribbons stood at four intervals by the front pews of the church.

John Edd Queen escorted his daughter to the altar and gave her in marriage. The brides formal wedding gown was designed of candlelight peau de soie and was enhanced by medallions of Alencon lace applied on the bodice and short sleeves, with the design flowing down the front of the gown to form a wide sweep at the center front hemline. The medallions were encrusted with seed pearls, sequins, bugle beads and crystals. The beading on the gown was done by the bride's maternal grandmother, Mrs. Christopher Glenn White of Kings Mountain. Appliques inside the hemline was lace from her grandmother's wedding outfit and embroidered in blue were the initials SVHCGW and their wedding date Nov. 27, 1912.

Her cathedral-length veil of imported silk illusion was designed and made by the bride. Her veil was caught to a peau de soie cap covered with Alencon lace medallions, crystals and sequins, outlining its design and individually arranged across the cap and back of the veil falling in a cascade effect to form a wide border around the entire veil. She carried a cluster bouquet of gardenias and yellow roses. The wedding handkerchief was borrowed from her maternal aunt, Mrs. Vernon Crosby of Kings Mountain. The wedding slippers held a medallion of lace applique at the toe.

Miss Bobbie Sutton of Atlanta, Ga., former college roommate of the bride at Peace college, attended the bride as maid of honor and Mrs. John Slate, II, of High Point was matron of honor. Bridesmaids were the bridegroom's sisters, Mrs. Donald Ellis Johnson of Forest City, Miss Kay Cannon of Bolling Springs, S. C., Mrs. John Christopher Queen of Fredericksburg, Va., sister-in-law of the bride; Miss Jeanne Mauney of

Syosset, Long Island, New York, co-sin of the bride; and Miss Mary Sheppard of Winston-Salem.

All the attendants wore sleeveless formal in copper color fabric designed along empire lines with empire waists and high necklines. Full flowing skirts fell from pleats at either side and back of the bodices. They carried small clusters of yellow
