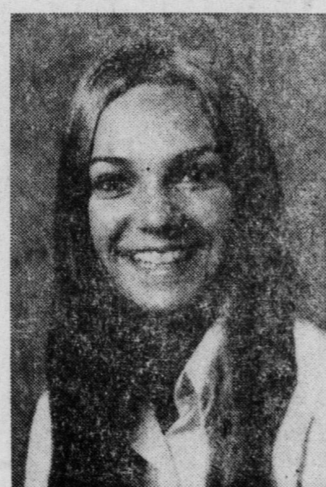

Miss Drury Candidate For DeMolay Honors

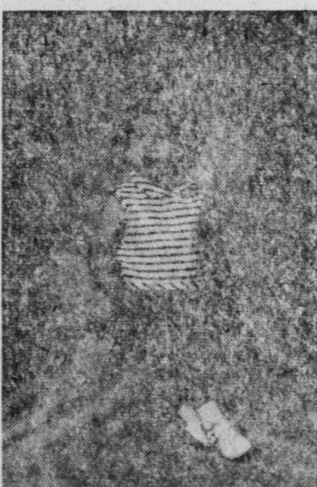

They are grandsons of Mrs. and Mrs. Charles Sims and Mr. and Mrs. Dewey Rathbone, all of Kings Mountain.

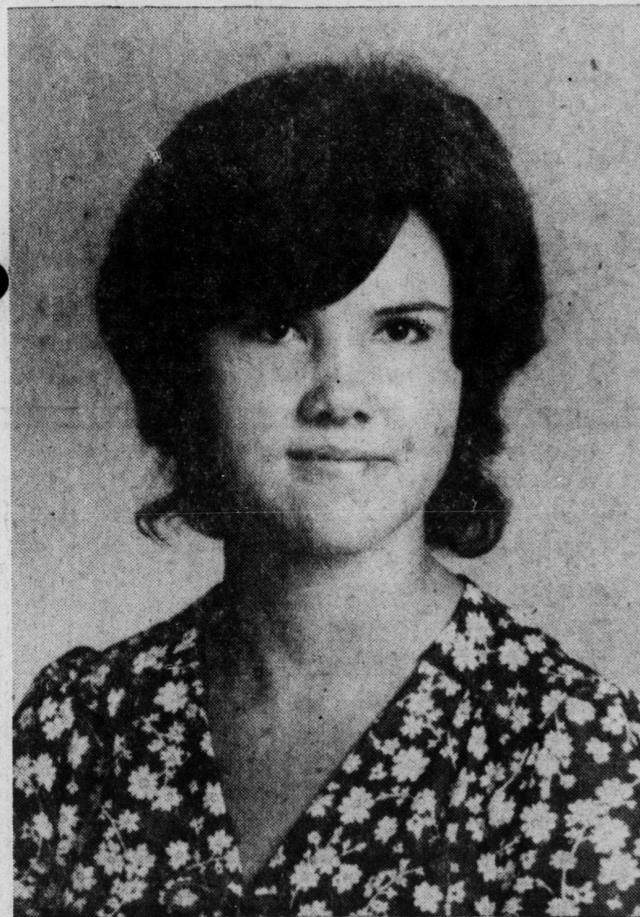

Season tickets to the Charlotte Opera Association's 1972-73 concert season may be obtained locally from Mrs. Charles F. Mauney who is heading the membership drive in this area.

Mrs. Mauney said the drive was kicked off last week at a luncheon at the home of Mrs. Robert V. Sisk, chairman, in Charlotte. Aim of the drive is to sell 4,000 tickets so that a Sunday afternoon performance can be scheduled in addition to the normal Monday evening performances.

Neighboring Charlotte has the only opera house on the east coast between Washington, D. C. and Charleston, S. C. and the Opera Association there is reviving opera this year by bringing top entertainment, exceptionally outstanding directors and stage managers, singing, dramatics, orchestration, painting and costumes, said Mrs. Mauney, to emphasize all the cultural arts.

To be presented will be two English operas, "Verdi Aida" on November 13th, which will feature a cast of 70 soldiers, 50 male voices in the chorus and more than 50 women's voices in the chorus; the English opera Gounod's "Romeo and Juliet" on January 29, 1973; and the Italian opera Douizetti's "Lucia Di Lammermoor" on April 16, 1973.
