**Miles Boyce, 33  
Is Sentenced**

A New Yorker formerly of Kings Mountain, charged with the armed robbery of Liberty Loan company in Kings Mountain on March 8, received a 12 to 16 year sentence in Cleveland County Superior court Monday.

Miles Edward Boyce, 33, pleaded guilty to a charge of armed robbery of the loan company in which \$210.95 was reportedly taken at gunpoint.

Boyce was arrested on the night of March 8 in a taxi cab in front of the Charlotte bus station after Charlotte police had been notified by Chief Tom McDewitt of Kings Mountain to be on the lookout for a person bearing Boyce's description.

Police recovered \$126 of the money.

Judge J. W. Jackson presided in Superior court Monday.
