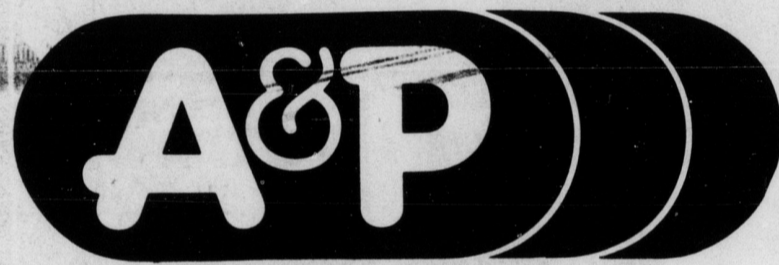
### GOSPEL SING
