

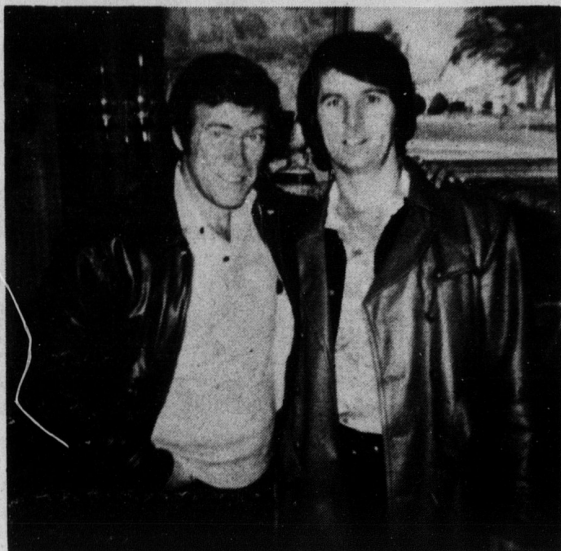
Dave Adams Wrecking Cars, Picking Fights

Kings Mountain native Dave Adams is in Clayton, Ga. these days. Doing what? Wrecking cars and motorcycles and picking fights with movie stars like Christopher George. Is he supposed to be doing these things? "That's what they're paying me to do," said the young Belmont-based businessman.

Actually, Dave is working as a stuntman on the set of a new movie entitled "Whiskey Mountain" which is being filmed in Clayton. This is his second visit to this quiet community in the past year and his second time working with movie actor Christopher George.

The day Dave was scheduled to negotiate some hairy turns in a car a large crowd turned out in Clayton to watch. The stunt required Dave to roar onto main street in a 1955 Chevy pickup, lose control and flip it end over end.

The pickup truck is supposed to head off the stars, George and Preston Pierce, who are riding motorcycles. Dave hit the

ramp at 45 mph, flipped the truck and skidded it end over end for almost 100 feet. He was shaken up and required a day's rest after being certified okay at the local hospital. But a day later he was back to handle

the motorcycle spills and fight scenes called for in

the script. About a year ago Dave worked with Christopher George in a shocker named "Grizzly." In that one Dave played "the upper half of the bear in the closeup work."

"In this picture," Dave said, "I double seven different people. One of them is the female lead — Roberta Collins. It's better than playing the upper torso of a grizzly bear, I guess."

Dave got his start in pictures with EO Productions in Shelby with a role in "Challenge." He worked as a stuntman on EO's second feature, "The Brass Ring," and has since worked on "D. J. Miller."

A few months ago, using stuntmen from Hollywood, Dave produced a half-hour film on stunt work, which is being peddled to TV.

The new film, "Whiskey Mountain," is due for release in May of 1977.

Man Arrested After Chase

Cecil Howard Campbell, 45, of 882 First St., was arrested Saturday following a high-speed chase by police.

Campbell was charged with carrying a concealed weapon, driving 70 miles per hour in a 35 mph zone, failure to stop for a blue light and siren, resisting arrest and public drunkenness.

Kings Mountain police reported the incident about 9:55 p. m. Saturday. Alerted to watch for the Campbell vehicle, the officer reported the vehicle failed to stop for the blue light and an eight-minute chase in the north side of town ensued.

When Campbell was stopped and removed from the vehicle officers said he had cuts on the neck, chin and forehead. Campbell told officers he was cut in a fight. He was treated and released from Kings Mountain Hospital.

Police said a friend of Campbell's said Campbell had fallen on some broken glass in the woods.

Campbell was placed in Cleveland County Jail to await a hearing on multiple charges.

Holiday Weekend Dangerous

Edward L. Powell, Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, reminds motorists the Thanksgiving holiday weekend is one of the most dangerous of the year on North Carolina's streets and highways.

Powell said that during the 4 day (102 hours) holiday weekend last year (1975), there were 1,546 traffic collisions, 978 persons injured, and 16 persons killed on North Carolina streets and highways.

"As we approach this dangerous holiday weekend with 1802 fatalities this year, we can improve this record, but we need the cooperation of the public. I am asking all motorists to drive defensively and cautiously," Powell said.

Colonel E. W. Jones, Commander of the State Highway Patrol said the patrol will be out in full force patrolling the streets and highways. "While particular attention will be paid to speeders and suspected drunken drivers, the troopers will also be on the lookout for all clear cut violators." He also reminds motorists that half of the traffic accidents involving fatalities last Thanksgiving weekend were caused by speeding and driving under the influence of alcohol.

Powell said, "law enforcement officers of the License and Theft Section of DMV will join the State Highway Patrol and other law enforcement officers in patrolling the streets and highways looking for traffic violators."

"Please help us keep the traffic fatalities and injuries down this year so we will have a SAFE and HAPPY Thanksgiving holiday" Powell concluded.
