Jim Medlin Is Named To Managerial Position

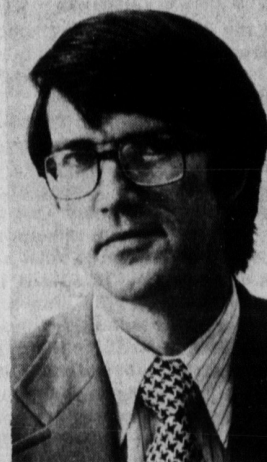

the demand meters at intervals of approximately three years.

(6) Adopt the proposed rate schedule shown in the report for outdoor lights and street lights in lieu of the existing rate schedule to recover the cost of service. The recommended schedule is approximately three percent less than Duke's lighting schedules.

(7) Modify the present policy of passing on the fuel surcharge to

reflect Duke's wholesale fuel surcharge adjusted for system losses.

The recommended retail rates are as follows: Residential - basic facilities charge - \$4.17.

Residential All-Electric basic facilities charge - \$5.08.

Commercial - minimum demand 30 KW with minimum bill 75 cents per KW - \$4.38.

Industrial - minimum demand 30 KW with minimum bill 75 cents per

KW - \$7.31.

Housing Authority - minimum bill - \$4.

Outdoor Lighting Service - lamp rated 7,500 Lumens \$3.70 per month. Lamp rated 20,000 Lumens \$6.40 per month.

Cohn said the proposed rate schedules would mean that some customers would pay higher bills while other customers will pay lower bills.
