The pamphlet is available, free, from the North Carolina Heart Association. It explains briefly why a heart attack occurs, and how the heart is affected. There are brief discussions of diet and exercise and the chances of returning to work and to a full life. The patient is asked some questions, also, but most importantly, he is urged to get the anbothering him.
