Will Instruct Course

Ron McKinney and Dave Mobley, police science instructors at Cleve-land Tech, will present a program about the psychological stress evaluator (PSE) before the Kings Mountain Police Department Friday

at 2 p. m. at City Hall.

The PSE is an instrument that detects, measures and geaphically displays certain stress-related components of the human voice.

The PSE has advantages over similar instrumentation. First is its simplicity, it has few moving parts and is relatively easy to learn to operate. Second, the PSE does not have to be used at the time of the interview or interrogation. A tape

recorder is used to make a permanent record of the interview, and later the tape is fed into the PSE and the voice reactions are recorded on a

The instrument has multiple uses: pre-emoloyment screening, psychoteraphy, determining theft, employe morale, efficiency or criminal activities. Doctors, lawyers, criminologists, law enforcement officials, and varied commercial organizations use the
