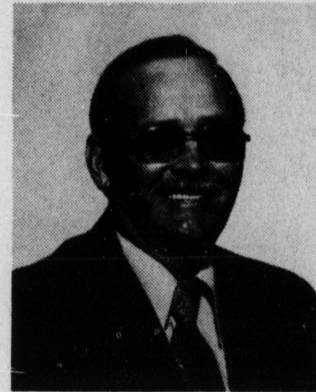
Retreat participants then attended the Erskine Mixed Chorus Spring Con-
