Mr. Ware, one of the founders of Home Federal Savings & Loan Association and an Augusta civic leader, died last Wednesday at his home.

A retired automobile dealer, he moved to Augusta in 1944 from Atlanta to operate Ware Buick Co. He was one of the founders and directors of Home Federal Savings & Loan Association and a former vice president. He served on many civic, religious and philanthropic organizations and was a member of Augusta Civic Country Club and the Pinnacle Club.

Mr. Ware was past president of the Augusta Rotary Club, Augusta Boys Club and Augusta Assembly. He was chairman of the Richmond County Cancer Society for 10 years and served on the organization state board. He was director of Georgia Railroad Bank & Trust Co. Mr. Ware received his education at Duke University and was associated with General Motors Acceptance Corp. for a number of years. He was manager in Melbourne, Australia and later manager of the Dallas and Atlanta offices.
