KM Boys Win 14th

Kings Mountain High's boys tennis team completed Southwestern Conference play Tuesday with a 6-3 victory over South Point.

The victory gave the Mountaineers second place in the final standings behind Shelby. KMHS carried a 14-2 overall mark into a match yesterday against non-conference foe Ashbrook. The Mounties end their regular season Monday at home against Hickory.

The Mountaineers swept five of the six singles matches Tuesday but dropped two of the three doubles. Rick Deaton was the only one to lose in singles play.

Kevin Morehead and Scott Summitt earned a hard-fought 7-5, 3-6, 6-1 doubles victory over South Point's Brett Widenhouse and Bill Lewis, and that victory should get them a high seeding for the upcoming bi-conference tournament.

Summitt also kept his conference record clean in singles competition, defeating Rodney Huffstetler 6-1, 6-2.

Coach Ed Guy will go to Shelby Sunday for the annual bi-conference meeting, at which time the coaches will determine the seedings for the tourney. KM's Tim Riddle will probably be ranked number one in singles, and several other KM players will probably receive high seedings.

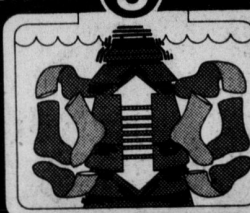

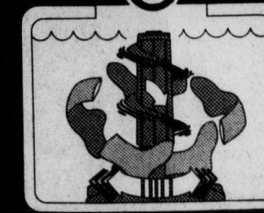

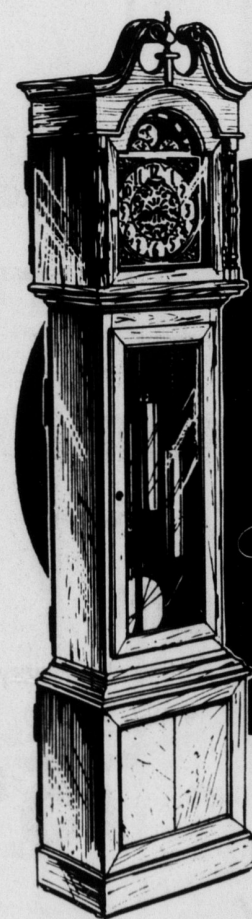
