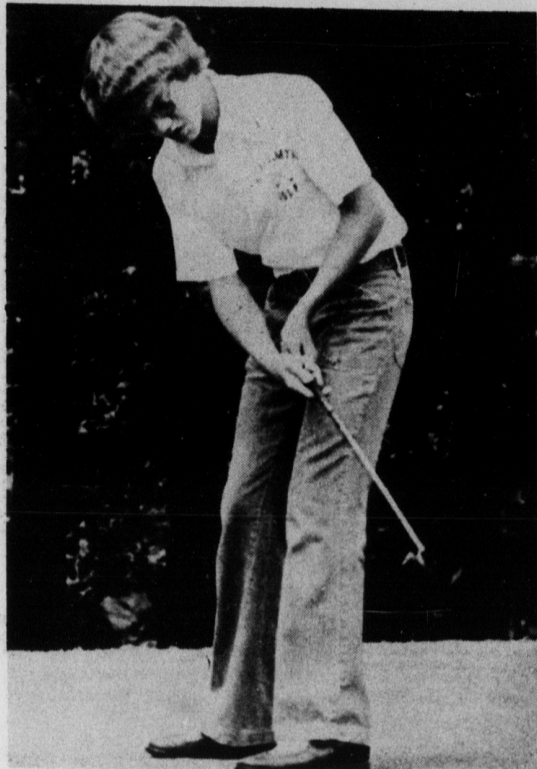


KMHS Golfers Second In Match At R-S Central

The Mountaineers and the other 11 Southwestern Conference schools were battling it out yesterday in the annual SWC tournament at Riverbend in Shelby.

The host Hilltoppers shot a 328 to win Thursday's match. KMHS shot 324 and Burns 364.

The second place finish gave the Mountaineers a final regular season record of five first place finishes, three seconds and one third in nine outings.

Sophomore Herbie Beam of the Mountaineers shared medalist honors with Glenn Deck of the Hilltoppers with a 77. But Beam was the only Mountaineer able to break 80, and that was the difference in the match.

John Gamble came in second for KM with an 81, followed by Darrell Austin, Darrell Forbes and Mark Sanders with 83's. Chip Harmon shot 98.

Other R-S scores included Rick Henson 78, Jeff Barnard 82, Kirk Sparks 86, Gary McMurray 88 and Whit Farier 101.

Burns scores included Botts 89, Wiggins 90, Scism, 91, Miller 94, Boggs 97 and Poston 105.
