Green was judged guilty by a Cleveland County Superior Court jury last Friday following more than eight hours of deliberation.

Judge Forrest Ferrell sentenced Green to life imprisonment on first degree rape and 40 years in prison on the second degree murder charge in the death of Mrs. Rosemary Knauer, 48, of Daytona Beach, Fla.

The rape-murder occured at the Kings Mountain Inn at the intersection of I-85 and Hwy. 161 on October 3, 1976. Police determined the actual attack took place in a small wooded area behind the motel. The body was discovered on October 4, by Kings Mountain officers.

Green, a Una, S. C. native, was employed by Mrs. Knauer at her penny arcade at the Cleveland County Fair last October.

afternoon to deliberate, but no decision was reached by 10:15 p. m. that evening and the jurors were sent home. The Jury began deliberations again at 10 a. m. Friday.

The trial lasted four and a half days during which testimony from 20 persons was heard, plus photographs of the victim and a tape recorded confession from Green being offered into evidence.

Judge Ferrell declared that Green's 40-year sentence was to begin at the conclusion of the life sentence. In this case Green will spend a minimum of 30 years in prison. Life is considered 80 years and convicted prisoners must serve 25 percent of the sentence before being eligible for parole con-

Kings Mountain Police Department was in charge of the investigation and according to Chief Earl Lloyd, "It was a very difficult case to follow because of the proximity to the motel of the crime and the

The jury retired on Thursday transient guests - suspects in-

The chief said 15-20 persons registered at the motel on Sunday. but left the next morning the weekend of the rape-murder, had to be checked out. A lot of time was consumed by various agencies assisting because of the fictitious names used by a few registered guests at the motel.

Chief Lloyd said he estimates 10,000 manhours were spent in the investigation. That includes the Kings Mountain force, the Cleveland County Sheriff's Department, the SBI, FBI, Law Enforcement Agency of S. C., U. S. Army personnel at Fort Bragg, the N. C. Attorney General's office and the departments in Raleigh. Favetteville. Myrtle Beach, S. C., New York City, Wheeling, W. Va. as well as agencies in Georgia, Florida, Louisiana and

The far-flung agencies were used in eliminating the suspects who were registerdd at the motel.
