

## Light Voter Turnout Tuesday

# Tech Bond Referendum Approved

A light turnout of voters Tuesday by 2-1 margin approved the \$5 million referendum for Cleveland County Technical Institute.

The total vote, representing a little over 20 percent of the registered voters in Cleveland County, was 4,155 for and 2,970 against.

In Kings Mountain, a total of 795 voters went to the polls at four polling places. East Kings Mountain and Bethware precincts did not favor.

The total Kings Mountain vote by precincts: East Kings Mountain, 79 for and 88 against; West Kings Mountain, 208 for and 130 against; Grover,

102 for and 58 against; and Bethware, 69 for and 81 against.

The approved referendum will finance the construction of 92,000 square feet of new and replacement instructional, office and library space for Cleveland Tech.

For the Cleveland County taxpayer, approval will mean up to an addition six and one-half cents per \$100 valuation in property.
