Mitchells Say Vows

Miss Dana Mauryne Fox became the bride of John Allen Mitchell III in a two o'clock formal wedding Saturday in Sardis Presbyterian Church in Charlotte.

The couple pledged vows of the double ring ceremony before Rev. Robert Smith, minister of the church, and Rev. James Armstrong, Jr., minister of Hickory Grove United Methodist Church in Charlotte, and former minister of the church. Mrs. Betty Guion was organist and Mrs. David Orr was soloist for the program of traditional music.

The altar of the church was enhanced by the simple elegance of cathedral tapers. Altar vases held white gladiolus, white chrysanthemums, and yellow daisies. A three branch candelabra was used for the candlelight ceremony.

The organ program included "Adagio in A

minor," by Bach, "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring," by Bach, "Prelude in Classic Style," by Gordon Young, "Trumpet in Dialogue," by Clerambault, "Toccata in D minor," by Bach, "Toccata in E minor," by Pachelbel, "Grand Jeu," by DuMaze. Mrs. Guion played "Rigaudon," by Gordon Young for the processional and "Toccata" (Symphony V), by Widor was played for the recessional. Mrs. Orr sang "The Greatest of These is Love," by Roberta Bitgood, before the ceremony, and "The Lord's Prayer" by Malotte.

Louis Knoblauch Fox escorted his daughter to the altar and gave her in marriage. The bride's wedding gown was a formal design of white silk organza, fashioned with a high neck. Venise lace bodice, cap sleeves of lace, with an empire front, and a natural waist in back. The A-line skirt was enhanced with Venise appliques and a scalloped lace border. From the waist in back, the appliques of lace created an ethereal look into the chapel train. Her full length matching veil was completely bordered with a lace scallop edge worn over a Gondola frame, covered with flowing Venise appliques. The bride carried a cascade of white miniature carnations, daisies, stephanotis, yellow miniature roses and
