chrysanthemum.

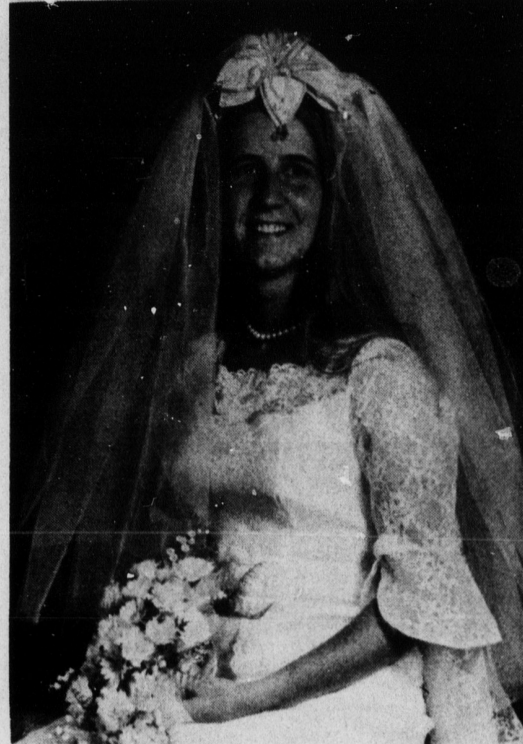
Monty Beasley of Cowpens, S. C. was best man for the bridegroom.
