Whip Cape Fear 8-2 Majors Close To Title

Kings Mountain's American League all-stars can wrap up the city's first Dixie Youth Majors State title in history tonight at Norwood.

Heading into semi-finals play last night, the District Three champions were the only unbeaten team in the double-elimination affair.

Kings Mountain was to play Bladen County last night and Cape Fear was to meet Kannapolis. As the lone unbeaten team, KM is sure to be in the final round tonight and with a victory both last night and tonight can clinch the title. A loss by KM, however, would move the championship game to Friday.

Rain forced postponement of Monday's quarter-finals to Tuesday, when KM handed Cape Fear its first loss, 8-2. Kevin Jones went the distance on the mound, hurling a four-hitter and fanning three. Clark took the loss for Cape Fear.

Kings Mountain decided the issue early, scoring single runs in the first and second innings, and adding four in the third and two in the fourth for an 8-0 lead. Jones and Jay Schronce led the KM plate attack with 2-for-2 apiece.

Defense was the big difference as KM's in-field time and again robbed Cape Fear batters of hits. Second baseman David Peeler and third baseman Kenny Mitchem played especially well.

"That was as good a defensive game as I've ever seen in little

league," said Coach Bubbles Pearson of KM. "The first two innings Cape Fear hit the ball real hard, but Peeler and Mitchem came up with some super defensive plays to get us out of the inning." The winner of the Norwood tourney will advance to the Dixie Youth World Series in Bartow, Fla., August 15.

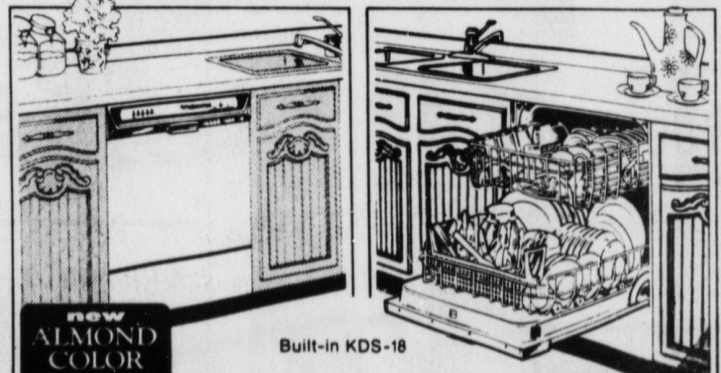
