Unbelievable?

Lou Sabetti, Jr. thought so too until he and his two cousins, John McGinnis and Doyle Campbell, became partners in C&S Mart at 229 S. Battleground Ave. in downtown Kings Mountain.

The trio of young men, all of whom have been in the shoe business for almost all their lives, have shoes literally hanging from the rafters in the building formerly occupied by Western Auto Store and more recently by Tony's Discount.

Sabetti, a former Eaton Corporation engineer and 1974 graduate of Western Carolina University, is manager of the family shoe store which offers discount prices from \$1 to \$9, the highest tags on men's shoes which normally sell for much more.

Lou Sabetti explained how he got into the shoe business.

His father, Kings Mountain insurance man Lois Sabetti, Sr., was selling insurance to Meyer Baker, 73, of Chester, S. C. and Mr. Baker told him he planned to retire and wanted to sell all his stock in five shoe stores in Chester, York, Whitmire, Gaffney and Rock Hill, South Carolina.

"We made a deal," said Lou, and off to South Carolina we went to bring back the shoes, approximately 45 truck loads.

Sabetti added that it was their intention to give Kings Mountain citizens a budget store featuring primarily shoes for the whole family at unbelievably

low prices. They also expect to stock some workclothes for men.

John McGinnis, son of Ethel and Paul McGinnis, grew up in the family business, McGinnis Department Store, and has been manager of McGinnis since 1965 when his father retired after a long career as a retail merchant.

Doyle Campbell has been associated with McGinnis for five years and is husband of Anita McGinnis.

Lou Sabetti, son of Virginia and Louis Sabetti, is a 1970 graduate of Kings Mountain High School and has worked after school and summer months at the family business. He worked for two years at K Mart Stores after graduation from college and was employed at Eaton Corporation for seven months in the engineering department.

Mr. Sabetti says the new shoe store will be operated similarly to the McGinnis Annex Store operated some years ago adjacent to McGinnis Department Store on S. Battleground and catering to the budget-conscious family. Paul McGinnis and Miss Margaret Cornwell operated that store for a number of years.

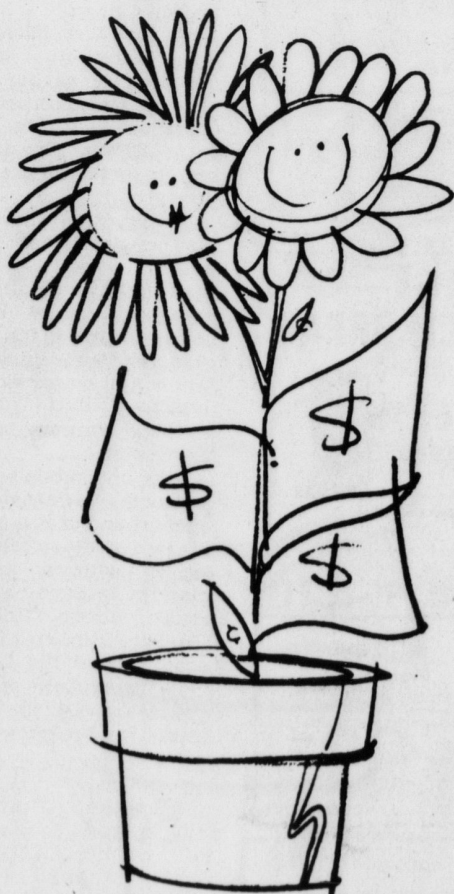
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
